6	WHEREAS, Over 1.7 million Americans have been diagnosed with HIV/AIDS since
7	1981 and more than 580,000 have died; and
8	WHEREAS, 1.1 million Americans are currently living with HIV/AIDS; and,
9,	WHEREAS, HIV/AIDS infections disproportionately impact gay and bisexual men,
10	especially gay and bisexual men of color, African American women and Transgendered
11	individuals; and
12	WHEREAS, Nearly 30,000 San Franciscans have diagnosed with AIDS since 1981
13	nearly 10,000 San Franciscans are currently living with AIDS; and
14	WHEARES, There are currently more than 20,000 San Franciscans living with
15	HIV/AIDS; and
16	WHEAREAS, The Ryan White legislation was enacted twenty years ago on August 18 th
