3	Resolution determining that the issuance of a Type 48 on-sale general public
4	premises liquor license to John Guiffre and Colin O'Malley, for John Colin's
5	located at 90 Natoma Street, will serve the public convenience and necessity of
6	the people of the City and County of San Francisco, in accordance with section
7	23958.4 of the California Business and Professions Code, with conditions.

9	WHEREAS, John Guiffre and Colin O'Malley are seeking issuance of a Type 48
10	on-sale general public premises liquor license for John Colin's, located at 90 Natoma
11	Street; and,
12	WHEREAS, The City Planning Department has verified that the area is properly
13	zoned; and
14	WHEREAS, The Police Department recommends that the liquor license
15	application be approved with conditions; now, therefore, be it
16	RESOLVED, That in accordance with Section 23958.4 of the California Business
17	and Professions Code, the Board of Supervisors of the City and County of San
18	Francisco hereby determines for the foregoing reasons that the issuance of a a Type 48
19	on-sale general public premises liquor license, to John Guiffre and Colin O'Malley for
20	John Colin's, located at 90 Natoma Street will serve the public convenience and
21	necessity of the people of the City and County of San Francisco.
22	Conditions: (1) Sales, service and consumption of alcoholic beverages shall only
23	be permitted between the hours of 11:00 a.m. and 2:00 a.m. each day of the week; (2)

The sale of alcoholic beverages for consumption off the premises is strictly prohibited;

(3) No noise shall be audible beyond the area under control of the licensee; (4)

Petitioners shall not permit their patrons or the general public to loiter or congregate on the sidewalks adjacent to the licensed premises; (5) The petitioner(s) shall be responsible for maintaining free of litter the area adjacent to the premises over which they have control; (6) The exterior sidewalks and parking lot(s) adjacent to the premises shall be equipped with lighting of sufficient power to illuminate and make easily discernible the appearance and conduct of all persons. (7) Additionally, the position of such lighting shall not disturb the normal privacy and use of any neighboring residences.
