

1 [Planning Code - Landmark Designation - William Shaughnessy Home]

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3 **Ordinance amending the Planning Code to designate the William Shaughnessy Home,**  
4 **located at 394 Fair Oaks Street, Assessor's Parcel Block No. 6511, Lot Nos. 042-044, on**  
5 **the west side of Fair Oaks Street between 25th Street and 24th Street, as a landmark**  
6 **consistent with the standards set forth in Article 10 of the Planning Code; affirming the**  
7 **Planning Department's determination under the California Environmental Quality Act;**  
8 **and making public necessity, convenience, and welfare findings under Planning Code,**  
9 **Section 302, and findings of consistency with the General Plan, and the eight priority**  
10 **policies of Planning Code, Section 101.1.**

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19 Be it ordained by the People of the City and County of San Francisco:

20 Section 1. Findings.

21 (a) Environmental and Land Use Findings.

22 (1) The Planning Department has determined that the Planning Code  
23 amendment proposed in this ordinance is subject to a Categorical Exemption from the  
24 California Environmental Quality Act (California Public Resources Code Sections 21000 et  
25 seq., hereinafter "CEQA") pursuant to Section 15308 of California Code of Regulations, Title  
14, Sections 15000 et seq., the Guidelines for implementation of the statute, for actions by

1 regulatory agencies for protection of the environment (in this case, landmark designation).  
2 Said determination is on file with the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors in File No.  
3 \_\_\_\_\_ and is incorporated herein by reference. The Board of Supervisors affirms  
4 this determination.

5 (2) Pursuant to Planning Code Section 302, the Board of Supervisors finds that  
6 the proposed landmark designation of the William Shaughnessy Home will serve the public  
7 necessity, convenience, and welfare for the reasons set forth in Historic Preservation  
8 Commission Resolution No. \_\_\_\_\_, recommending approval of the proposed  
9 designation, which is incorporated herein by reference.

10 (3) The Board of Supervisors finds that the proposed landmark designation of  
11 the William Shaughnessy Home is consistent with the General Plan and with Planning Code  
12 Section 101.1(b) for the reasons set forth in Historic Preservation Commission Resolution No.  
13 \_\_\_\_\_, which is incorporated herein by reference.

14 (b) General Findings.

15 (1) On March 3, 2026 the Board of Supervisors adopted Resolution No. 115-26,  
16 initiating landmark designation of the William Shaughnessy Home as a San Francisco  
17 landmark pursuant to Section 1004.1 of the Planning Code. On March 6, 2026, the Mayor  
18 approved the resolution. Said resolution is on file with the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors in  
19 File No. 260069.

20 (2) Pursuant to Charter Section 4.135, the Historic Preservation Commission  
21 has authority “to recommend approval, disapproval, or modification of landmark designations  
22 and historic district designations under the Planning Code to the Board of Supervisors.”

23 (3) The Landmark Designation Fact Sheet dated May 20, 2026 was prepared  
24 by Planning Department Preservation staff. All preparers meet the Secretary of the Interior’s  
25 Professional Qualification Standards for historic preservation program staff, as set forth in

1 Code of Federal Regulations Title 36, Part 61, Appendix A. The report was reviewed for  
2 accuracy and conformance with the purposes and standards of Article 10 of the Planning  
3 Code. A copy of the Landmark Designation Fact Sheet is on file with the Clerk of the Board of  
4 Supervisors in File No. \_\_\_\_\_ and is incorporated herein by reference.

5 (4) The Historic Preservation Commission, at its regular meeting of May 20,  
6 2026, reviewed Planning Department staff’s analysis of the historical significance of the  
7 William Shaughnessy Home set forth in the Landmark Designation Fact Sheet.

8 (5) On May 20, 2026, after holding a public hearing on the proposed  
9 designation and having considered the specialized analyses prepared by Planning  
10 Department staff and the Landmark Designation Fact Sheet, the Historic Preservation  
11 Commission recommended designation of the William Shaughnessy Home as a landmark  
12 consistent with the standards set forth in Section 1004 of the Planning Code, by Resolution  
13 No. \_\_\_\_\_. Said resolution is on file with the Clerk of the Board in File No. \_\_\_\_\_.

14 (6) The Board of Supervisors hereby finds that the William Shaughnessy Home  
15 has a special character and special historical, cultural, architectural, and aesthetic interest and  
16 value, and that its designation as a landmark will further the purposes of and conform to the  
17 standards set forth in Article 10 of the Planning Code. In doing so, the Board hereby  
18 incorporates by reference the findings of the Landmark Designation Fact Sheet.

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20 Section 2. Designation.

21 Pursuant to Section 1004.3 of the Planning Code, the William Shaughnessy Home,  
22 located at 394 Fair Oaks Street, Assessor’s Parcel Block Nos. 6511, Lot No. 042-044, is  
23 hereby designated as a San Francisco landmark consistent with the standards set forth in  
24 Section 1004. Appendix A to Article 10 of the Planning Code is hereby amended to include  
25 this property.

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Section 3. Required Data.

(a) The description, location, and boundary of the landmark site consists of the footprint of the William Shaughnessy Home, located on Assessor’s Parcel Block No. 6511, Lot Nos. 042-044, on the west side of Fair Oaks Street between 25th Street and 24th Street in San Francisco’s Mission neighborhood, as shown in the Landmark Designation Fact Sheet.

(b) The characteristics of the landmark that justify its designation are described and shown in the Landmark Designation Fact Sheet and other supporting materials contained in Planning Department Record Docket No. 2026-XXXXXXDES. In brief, the William Shaughnessy Home, located at 394 Fair Oaks Street, is eligible for local designation as an intact and exemplary example of a Queen Anne home. The home was constructed circa 1894 in the Mission neighborhood by prolific contractor William Shaughnessy as his personal residence. Shaughnessy was known as the president of the California Mill Co., a position he resumed while living in the subject property. After his 1906 death, his wife and five children remained in the property but demolished the lot’s carriage home for flats to improve family income. As a prominent corner property, the home displays exuberant Queen Anne features and retains a high degree of integrity.

(c) The particular features that should be preserved, or replaced in kind as determined necessary, are those generally shown in photographs and described in the Landmark Designation Fact Sheet, which can be found in Planning Department Record Docket No. 2026-002410DES, and which are incorporated in this designation by reference as though fully set forth herein. This designation does not identify any interior character-defining features. Specifically, the features that are character-defining and shall be preserved or replaced in kind are the exterior elevations, form, massing, structure, rooflines, architectural ornament, and materials of the property, identified as:

- 1 (1) Corner location of the house on the property with front and side setbacks;
- 2 (2) Front facing gable roof with shingles;
- 3 (3) Polygonal corner tower capped by cupola with finial;
- 4 (4) Asymmetrical facade;
- 5 (5) Rectangular form with side and rear bay;
- 6 (6) First level columned entry portico with composite columns and single entry wood
- 7 door with transoms and sidelites;
- 8 (7) Second story front curved balcony with decorative wood balustrades, portico
- 9 with wood columns, bracketed hood, floriate ornamentation, and recessed
- 10 double entry wood doors with grids and above transom;
- 11 (8) South facing dormer with pitched roof;
- 12 (9) Stained glass windows at front and side, with decorative surrounds at top;
- 13 (10) Wood windows, including double hung windows with ogee lugs and decorative
- 14 grids, generally with hooded surrounds;
- 15 (11) Applied wooden ornamentation including dentils, wood panels, floriate design
- 16 and colonettes; and
- 17 (12) Horizontal wood siding at upper floors, brick and mortar at ground level.

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Section 4. Effective Date.

This ordinance shall become effective on the 31st day after enactment. Enactment occurs when the Mayor signs the ordinance, the Mayor returns the ordinance unsigned or does not sign the ordinance within ten days of receiving it, or the Board of Supervisors overrides the Mayor's veto of the ordinance.
