

1 [Budget and Legislative Analyst Performance Audits - Street Response Teams and Permanent
2 Supportive Housing Funds - FY2022-2023]

3 **Motion directing the Budget and Legislative Analyst to conduct two performance audits**
4 **in Fiscal Year (FY) 2022-2023 of (1) the City’s street teams, including (i) the Fire**
5 **Department’s street response teams, (ii) the Department of Homelessness and**
6 **Supportive Housing’s outreach and response teams, (iii) the Department of Public**
7 **Health’s street medicine and other teams, and (iv) planning, implementation, structure,**
8 **and coordination for management of the street teams amongst various City**
9 **departments, including the Department of Emergency Management; and (2) permanent**
10 **supportive housing funds administered by the Department of Homelessness and**
11 **Supportive Housing, including sources and allowable uses of funds and planning,**
12 **decision-making, and reporting on fund allocations and populations served.**

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14 WHEREAS, It is the policy of the Board of Supervisors that each program of the City
15 and County of San Francisco be the subject of a performance audit at least once every eight
16 years; and

17 WHEREAS, The function of regular performance audits is to ensure that City
18 departments and agencies make prudent and efficient use of City resources and also
19 effectively perform the functions assigned to them by the Charter and applicable laws; now,
20 therefore, be it;

21 MOVED, That the Budget and Legislative Analyst is hereby directed to conduct a
22 performance audit in FY2022-2023 of street crisis response teams, including the structure and
23 coordination for management of the street teams amongst various City departments; and, be

1 FURTHER MOVED, That the Budget and Legislative Analyst is hereby directed to
2 conduct a performance audit in FY2022-2023 of permanent supportive housing funds
3 administered by the Department of Homelessness and Supportive Housing, including sources
4 and allowable uses of funds and planning, decision-making, and reporting on fund allocations
5 and populations served.

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
