

1 [Community Aggregation and Public Power on Treasure Island.]

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3 **Resolution urging that the San Francisco Public Utilities Commission explore, based**
4 **on the findings of the LAFCO reports, the implementation of Community Aggregation**
5 **and Public Power on Treasure Island.**

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7 WHEREAS, Treasure Island currently obtains its power on the private market, not
8 subject to the exclusive franchise as mainland San Francisco and thus Treasure Island
9 affords the ideal opportunity for San Francisco to explore municipal power; and,

10 WHEREAS, The San Francisco Local Area Formation Commission (LAFCO) has
11 completed an Electrical Feasibility Study (R.W. Beck, January 2004) "it would appear that it is
12 in the City's best long-term interest to continue to pursue the acquisition of transmission and
13 distribution facilities within San Francisco;" and,

14 WHEREAS, The LAFCO has also completed an AB 117 Assessment Report (R.W.
15 Beck, August 2003) which finds that "Under conservative assumptions, annual estimated
16 savings due to Community Aggregation in San Francisco are likely to be between \$10 and
17 \$35 million annually (5-20%)" and,

18 WHEREAS, Further Community Aggregation and or Public Power studies must pursue
19 implementing an expanded renewable energy portfolio as an alternative to fossil fuel, be it

20 **RESOLVED**, That the Board of Supervisors urges that the San Francisco Public
21 Utilities Commission explore, based on the findings of the LAFCO reports, implementation of
22 Community Aggregation and environmentally sustainable Public Power on Treasure Island.

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
