12	A. On September 20, 2007, at a duly noticed public hearing, the Planning		
13	Commission in Resolution No. 17486 found that the proposed landmark designation of 1601		
14	Larkin Street (the First St. John's United Methodist Church) was consistent with the City's		
15	General Plan and with Planning Code Section 101.1(b). In addition, the Planning Commission		
16	recommended that the Board of Supervisors adopt the landmark designation. A copy of said

Pursuant to Section 1004 of the Planning Code, 1601 Larkin Street (the First St. John's United Methodist Church), Lot No. 006 in Assessor's Block No. 0620, is hereby designated a Landmark under Article 10 of the Planning Code. This designation was initiated by Resolution No. 308-07, adopted by the Board of Supervisors on June 5, 2007, by Resolution 615 of the Landmarks Preservation Advisory Board, and Resolution No. 17486 of the Planning Commission, which Resolutions are on file with the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors in File No. 071544 and which Resolutions are incorporated herein by reference as though fully set forth.

- (a) The description, location, and boundary of the Landmark site consists of the City parcel located at the northwest corner of Larkin and Clay Streets (Lot No. 006 in Assessor's Block No. 0620), with the street address of 1601 Larkin Street (the First St. John's United Methodist Church).
- (b) The characteristic of the Landmark that justify its designation are described and shown in the Landmark Designation Report adopted by the Landmarks Preservation Advisory

- 1 Board on August 15, 2007 and other supporting materials contained in Planning Department
- 2 Docket No. 2007.0600L. In brief, the National Register of Historic Places characteristics of
- 3 the Landmark that justify its designation are as follows:
 - (1) Association with the work of a master architect, George Washington Kramer;
 - (2) Association with the Combination Church Plan, which combines the characteristics of the Akron Plan Sunday School plan with the Pulpit-in-the-Corner plan;
 - (3) Association with the eclectic mix of Mission Revival and English Gothic Revival architectural features, reflecting a style that breaks with traditional Church imagery, and a combined style particularly suited to California; and
 - (4) The existing Church building retains a high level of physical integrity.
 - (c) The particular exterior features that shall be preserved, or replaced in-kind as determined necessary, are those generally shown in photographs and described in the Landmark Designation Report, which can be found in Planning Department Docket No. 2007.0600L and which is incorporated in this designation by reference as though fully set forth. In brief, the description of the particular exterior features that should be preserved are the elevations of 1601 Larkin Street, including all architectural finishes, features, and fabric on the exterior of the buildings, including: the exterior features of the building that reflect its interior and that express its mix of the Mission revival and English Gothic styles; the brick base of the structure; the stucco walls of each elevation; the corner bell tower; the complex roof form; the stained glass window and fenestration throughout the building; the gabled entrance hoods; and the wood doors and bronze handles at the principal entrance.

Section 4. The property shall be subject to further controls and procedures, including Certificate of Appropriateness requirements, pursuant to Planning Code Article 10.
