3 **Resolution authorizing the San Francisco Fire Department to accept a gift of a Worth-**
4 **Built Hand Pumped Fire Engine (“Broderick Fire Engine”) from Fireman’s Fund**
5 **Insurance Company and Allianz Global Risks US Insurance Company, also known as**
6 **Allianz Global Corporate & Specialty North America, valued at \$123,000 for use by the**
7 **San Francisco Fire Department Museum.**

9 WHEREAS, Fireman’s Fund Insurance Company and Allianz Global Risks US
10 Insurance Company, also known as Allianz Global Corporate & Specialty North America, have
11 graciously donated a gift of an 1855 Worth-Built Hand Pumped Fire Engine, valued at
12 \$123,000, for use by the San Francisco Fire Department for the San Francisco Fire
13 Department Museum; and

14 WHEREAS, The 1855 Worth-Built Hand-Pumped Fire Engine is the first engine built in
15 California; and

16 WHEREAS, In 1855, this engine went into service with Empire Engine Company No. 1
17 of the San Francisco Fire Department; and

18 WHEREAS, On October 7, 1859, upon the death of United States Senator David
19 Broderick, the Empire Company changed its name to Broderick Engine Company No. 1 in
20 honor of Senator Broderick who had been the first foreman of Empire Company; and

21 WHEREAS, Upon receipt of this engine, it will be placed in the San Francisco Fire
22 Department Museum; and

23 WHEREAS, At its regular meeting on Thursday, August 27, 2015, the Fire Commission
24 voted to recommend that the Board of Supervisors approve the gift and authorized the Chief
25 of the Fire Department to accept the gift to the Department; and

1 WHEREAS, The Fire Commission Resolution is on file with the Clerk of the Board of
2 Supervisors in File No. 151012, which is hereby declared to be a part of this resolution as if
3 set forth fully herein; now, therefore, be it

5 of the Fire Department to accept the gift of an 1855 Worth-Built Hand Pumped Fire Engine,





RESOLUTION 2015-07

RESOLUTION RECOMMENDING THAT THE FIRE COMMISSION ACCEPT THE DONATION FROM FIREMAN'S FUND INSURANCE COMPANY AND ALLIANZ GLOBAL RISKS US INSURANCE COMPANY MARKETED AS ALLIANZ GLOBAL CORPORATE & SPECIALTY NORTH AMERICA, OF THE 1855 WORTH-BUILT HAND PUMPED FIRE ENGINE ("EMPIRE"/"BRODERICK")

WHEREAS, the 1855 Worth-Built Hand Pumped Fire Engine is the first fire engine built in California;

WHEREAS, Mr. Worth, patternmaker by trade, had his shop on Belden Place near Pine Street in San Francisco;

WHEREAS, in 1855, this engine went into service with Empire Engine Company No. 1 of the San Francisco Fire Department.

WHEREAS, on October 7, 1859, upon the death of United States Senator David Broderick, the Empire Company changed its name to Broderick Engine Company No. 1 in honor of Senator Broderick who had been the first foreman of Empire Company. At that time Broderick's name was stamped to the galley of the engine.

WHEREAS, as of July 12, 2015, the appraisal of the Broderick engine is \$123,000.00;

WHEREAS, when this historic engine is received, she will be placed in the San Francisco Fire Department Museum. In addition to the donation of the Worth engine, Fireman's Fund will be donating other fire service artifacts, memorabilia and ephemera.


RESOLVED, that the Fire Commission respectfully accepts the donation of the 1855 Worth hand-built pumped fire engine;

FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Fire Commission and Fire Department extend their gratitude to Fireman's Fund Insurance Company And Allianz Global Risks US Insurance Company marketed as Allianz Global Corporate & Specialty North America, and to the Guardians of the City.

USED EQUIPMENT DONATION AGREEMENT

This USED EQUIPMENT DONATION AGREEMENT ("Agreement") is made effective as of September 2, 2015 ("Effective Date"), by and between Fireman's Fund Insurance Company, a California corporation, with offices at 777 San Marin Drive, Novato, California 94988 ("Transferor"), and San Francisco Fire Department with offices at 698 Second Street, San Francisco, Ca 94107-2015 ("Transferee").

Transferor and Transferee agree as follows:

Section 1: Removal of Equipment; Consideration; Transfer of Title

1.1 At a mutually acceptable time and date, but not later than thirty (30) days after the Effective Date, Transferee will, at Transferee's sole cost, expense and risk, remove the equipment identified in Exhibit A to this Agreement ("Equipment") from Transferor's offices at the address listed above (the "Site"). In the alternative, Transferor may, with prior notice to Transferee, deliver the Equipment to Transferee at Transferee's offices at the address listed above.

1.2 The sole consideration to benefit Transferor as a result of the transactions contemplated by this Agreement shall be the convenience of having the Equipment removed from the Site. No monetary consideration shall be due to Transferor under the terms of this Agreement and the transfer of the Equipment is being made as a charitable donation.

1.3 Effective upon removal of the Equipment from the Site, Transferor hereby transfers, assigns and conveys to Transferee all of Transferor's right, title and interest in and to the Equipment as well as all liabilities, claims, and the like, whether known to FFIC or not. Upon such removal, Transferee will assume the sole responsibility and risk of loss for the Equipment on the same basis as any other property owned by Transferee.

Section 2: Disclaimer of Warranties; Limitation of Liability

2.1 **THE EQUIPMENT WILL BE CONVEYED TO TRANSFEEE "AS IS" AND "WHERE IS" AND "WITH ALL FAULTS". TRANSFEROR MAKES NO WARRANTIES, EXPRESS OR IMPLIED, WHETHER OF TITLE, SAFETY, MERCHANTABILITY OR FITNESS FOR ANY PARTICULAR PURPOSE OR USE OR OTHERWISE, ON THE EQUIPMENT.**

2.2 **UNDER NO CIRCUMSTANCES WILL TRANSFEROR BE LIABLE TO TRANSFEEE OR ANY OTHER PERSON FOR ANY DIRECT, INDIRECT, INCIDENTAL, SPECIAL, PUNITIVE OR CONSEQUENTIAL DAMAGES ARISING OUT OF OR RELATED TO THIS AGREEMENT, THE CONDITION OF THE EQUIPMENT OR THE USE OR OPERATION OF THE EQUIPMENT BY TRANSFEEE.**

2.3 The description of the Equipment is for the sole purpose of identifying the Equipment and does not constitute a representation or warranty in any respect whatsoever. Transferor has made no representations or warranties to Transferee regarding the quality, nature, condition or composition of the Equipment; nor the compliance of the Equipment with the requirements of any specifications, laws or regulations; and Transferee has been given the opportunity to reject the Equipment, in part and in whole, and has declined to do so.

Section 3: Representations and Covenants of Transferee

Transferee represents and warrants to Transferor that it is a not for profit organization and that the Equipment will be utilized as specified in writing by Transferee, and not for the purpose of resale, personal use, or use by any organization other than the Transferee indicated herein. Upon acceptance, Transferee shall be responsible for compliance with all laws and regulations applicable to use of the Equipment, whether required of Transferor or otherwise. Transferee agrees to indemnify and hold Transferor harmless from any and all claims, damages, costs or attorneys' fees arising from a claim of injury to persons or property due to the use or misuse of the Equipment by Transferor.

Section 4: Entire Agreement; Amendments

This Agreement embodies the entire agreement between Transferor and Transferee with respect to the Equipment and supersedes all prior or contemporaneous agreements, proposals, representations and understandings of the parties, whether written or oral concerning the Equipment. This Agreement may not be amended or modified except by a writing signed by both parties.

Section 5: Governing Law

This Agreement shall be governed by, and construed in accordance with, the laws of the State of California as applicable to agreements made and wholly performed in California without regard to its conflict of law provisions.
