1. Given the continued limitation on indoor congregate shelter spaces and uncertainty over our housing efforts due to COVID, what plans are in place to safely house our unhoused population once the air quality deteriorates to toxic levels?
2. In the past, we've utilized public buildings such as our library as wildfire refuge. Given that it's possible there will still likely be some level of capacity restrictions and individuals may not be vaccinated by the peak of the wildfire season, what are we doing to identify and leverage City-owned sites that can be used as adequate wildfire refuge?
3. What plans do we have in place to quickly and effectively distribute PPE equipment, including N95 masks, to vulnerable populations?
4. COVID-19 has created a number of City systems for mass information dissemination and outreach to San Franciscans. Do we have plans to keep the appropriate systems in place in preparation for fire season? Which COVID response efforts can we continue to adapt to wildfire response?
5. In the past, we have had to close down schools due to air quality issues. Our schools are facing an additional challenge as students return to in-person learning this fall. What planning is SFUSD doing to plan for potential closures again due to air quality issues and what can the City provide to support our schools in the event of closures?
