Resolution celebrating 2024 as Year of the Dragon and recognizing February 10, 2024, as the start of Lunar New Year 4722.

WHEREAS, 2024 marks Lunar year 4722, the Year of the Dragon, which begins on Saturday, February 10, 2024; and

WHEREAS, Celebrations for the Lunar New Year begin with the New Moon on the first day of the new year and end on the full moon 15 days later; and

WHEREAS, The first Chinese New Year Parade took place in San Francisco's Chinatown in 1885 with a 15-day celebration and a block-long golden dragon preceded by the red pearl of potentiality; and

WHEREAS, In an effort to celebrate Chinatown and draw visitors to Chinese-owned businesses, the Chinese Chamber of Commerce transformed the Chinese New Year celebration into a Street Carnival at Portsmouth Square in 1953; and

WHEREAS, To further its efforts to promote Chinatown, the Chinese Chamber of Commerce launched the first Miss Chinatown, U.S.A. beauty pageant in 1958 as part of the New Year festivities; and

WHEREAS, The Chinese New Year parade draws a larger crowd each year with increasingly more marching units and floats, and the San Francisco Chinese New Year parade is the largest parade celebrating Chinese New Year outside of Asia; and

WHEREAS, The celebration of Chinese New Year in San Francisco has become a culturally significant event and its grand parade is now a recognized civic pride event of our city; and

WHEREAS, The annual Chinese New Year Festival and Parade that has

historically included the Miss Chinatown Pageant and Coronation Ball, has now expanded to nearly month-long festivities that encompass a Flower Market Fair, Choy Sun Doe, Basketball Jamboree, a Chinatown YMCA Run, and Community Street Fair, have provided an economic boost to our local economy beyond just Chinatown; and

WHEREAS, The Lunar New Year may be known as Chinese New Year, but it is also celebrated as Seollal in Korean communities, with the Tet Festival by the Vietnamese, and as Losar in Tibet; and

WHEREAS, The Lunar New Year, also known as the Spring Festival, is a significant holiday for Asian families to gather together, honor their ancestors, welcome the New Year with hopes of prosperity and good health, and celebrate traditions and traditional foods; and

WHEREAS, The Dragon is a special creature in Chinese culture and is revered as auspicious and powerful, has represented imperial power in China for centuries, and represents nobility, prosperity, and wisdom; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors of the City and County of San Francisco bids farewell to 2023, Year of the Rabbit, and commits to celebrate Asian families and Lunar New Year Festivities; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors of the City and County of San Francisco wishes all families good luck, prosperity, and continued good health in the Year of the Dragon; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors of the City and County of San Francisco celebrates 2024 as the Year of the Dragon and recognizes February 10, 2024, as the start of Lunar New Year 4722.
