URGING THE CALIFORNIA LEGISLATURE TO PASS SB 123 (PEACE) PROHIBITING REFINERS, DISTRIBUTORS, MANUFACTURERS OR TRANSPORTERS OF MOTOR VEHICLE FUELS FROM DISCRIMINATING IN PRICE BETWEEN DIFFERENT PURCHASERS, AND SUPPORTING THE EFFORTS OF UNITED STATES SENATOR BARBARA BOXER AND CALIFORNIA ATTORNEY GENERAL BILL LOCKYER TO INVESTIGATE ANTI-COMPETITIVE GASOLINE PRICING PRACTICES.

WHEREAS. Refiners continue to pursue unfair strategies such as zone pricing and wholesale pricing mechanisms that hurt San Francisco consumers and independent dealers disproportionately; and

There has been a renewed flurry of concern about the problem, including new legislation to prohibit wholesale price discrimination, a call for Federal Trade Commission investigation by US Senator Barbara Boxer, and an investigation by California Attorney General Bill Lockyer; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors of the City and County of San Francisco urges the California Legislature to pass SB 123 (Peace) prohibiting refiners, distributors, manufacturers or transporters of motor vehicle fuels from discriminating in price between different purchasers; and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED. That the Board of Supervisors supports the efforts of US Senator Barbara Boxer to urge the Federal Trade Commission to look into higher costs of gasoline supply for independent dealers and the efforts of California Attorney General Bill Lockver to investigate anti-competitive gasoline pricing practices.
