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North Beach Neighborhood Commercial District, for reconstruction or repair after a fire, shall not be considered an abandonment of such use pursuant to Section 178 of this Code, *for up to six years from the date of the fire*, unless the original liquor store elects to relocate somewhere else permanently. Temporary relocation of liquor stores in the North Beach Neighborhood Commercial District that have been closed as a result of a fire to another location in the North Beach Neighborhood Commercial District shall not require a new Conditional Use Permit for the duration of up to *three six* years of interim relocation, *from the date of the fire*.

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Section 3. Effective Date. This ordinance shall become effective 30 days after enactment. Enactment occurs when the Mayor signs the ordinance, the Mayor returns the ordinance unsigned or does not sign the ordinance within ten days of receiving it, or the Board of Supervisors overrides the Mayor's veto of the ordinance.
