I'm standing with Supervisor Matt Dorsey to strongly oppose a plan by the city employees' pension fund to decamp from Mid-Market to a luxury high-rise in the Financial District.

It's a slap in the face to neighborhood residents. It's less convenient to the city workers it serves. It makes no sense financially. It's inconsistent with the San Francisco General Plan. And it sets a worrisome precedent in diminishing Civic Center foot traffic and economic activity that other city departments could soon seek to follow.

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- Our city's Shelter-In-Place Hotel program turned that neighborhood's largest hotels into massive drug-permissive shelters — forcing taxpayers to pay more than \$40 million in damages to just three Mid-Market hotels alone. (Including the 459-room Whitcomb, which remains shuttered.)
- Our city tolerated 24-hour-a-day drug dealing on our major thoroughfares for nearly two years, with sanctioned and unsanctioned encampments throughout the Civic Center and Mid-Market neighborhoods that residents still haven't fully recovered from.
- Our city's so-called "Linkage Center" at U.N. Plaza was a magnet for rampant drug scenes, drug markets, and drug-driven lawlessness — hurting countless neighborhood businesses and causing the closure of a long-anticipated Whole Foods supermarket, which remains closed to this day.

City government caused these neighborhood problems. And city government has a moral obligation now to help revitalize the Civic Center and Mid-Market area — not abandon it.

I urge SFERS to drop its planned move — and I urge City Hall to support legislation Supervisor Dorsey is authoring to require city agencies to honor the Civic Center Area Plan and be full partners in helping reinvigorate our Mid-Market and Civic Center neighborhoods.
