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16	Be it ordained by the People of the City and County of San Francisco:
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18	Section 1. General Background and Findings.
19	(a) The Vicha Ratanapakdee Way Stairway is the public right-of-way in the Anza Vista
20	neighborhood between O'Farrell Street and Terra Anza Avenue, which runs parallel to Anza
21	Vista and St. Joseph's Avenues and is perpendicular to O'Farrell Street and Terra Anza
22	Avenue. Mr. Ratanapakdee was an 84-year-old immigrant from Thailand who was well known
23	in the Anza Vista neighborhood for his hour-long walks each morning, a ritual that kept him
24	vibrant and healthy during the COVID-19 pandemic.
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- (b) On January 28, 2021, Mr. Ratanapakdee, while walking peacefully in the neighborhood, was suddenly and violently shoved to the pavement by an assailant, resulting in severe head injuries from which Mr. Ratanapakdee tragically died shortly after the attack. In honor of Mr. Ratanapakdee and in recognition of this tragic event and its impact on San Francisco, the Board of Supervisors adopted, and the Mayor signed, Resolution No. 235-22, officially changing the name of Sonora Lane to "Vicha Ratanapakdee Way." A copy of this Resolution is on file with the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors in File No. 220248.
- (c) The Justice for Vicha Ratanapakdee Foundation plans to create a collaborative public art mosaic installation at Vicha Ratanapakdee Way. Such an art installation (the "Project") would enhance the pedestrian experience on the Vicha Ratanapakdee Way Stairway by making a more attractive passage that will visually honor the life of Mr. Ratanapakdee in the form of symbols and patterns and reinforce the importance of peace among all peoples, in accordance with Mr. Ratanapakdee's deepest values.
- (d) The Justice for Vicha Ratanapakdee Foundation intends to partner with mosaic artists Sarah Siskin and Thitiwat Phromratanapongse to complete the Project with volunteers assisting in maintaining the stairway. Sarah Siskin is a mural artist and educator with extensive experience in community-focused art, having founded the Bay Area Mural Festival and contributed to international projects. Thitiwat Phromratanapongse is a mural artist with a fine arts background, known for his work with the Estria Foundation and community-driven projects in the Bay Area.
- (e) The Project received a Letter of Support from San Francisco Public Works on January 31, 2024 for this Tier 3 Project under the Love Our Neighborhoods Program. A copy of said Letter of Support is on file with the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors in File No. 240806.

1 (f) On May 6, 2024, the Arts Commission, in Resolution No. 0506-24-137, approved 2 the Project. A copy of this Resolution is on file with the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors in 3 File No. 240806. (g) Pursuant to Public Works Code Sections 786 et seq., Public Works issues the 4 approval for a Tier 3 Love Our Neighborhood Project in contrast to most other major 5 6 encroachment permits that require Board of Supervisors approval. In order to maximize use 7 of the financial contributions to the Justice for Vicha Ratanapakdee Foundation and other 8 financial contributions for purposes of design, fabrication, installation, and maintenance of the 9 Project, and in recognition of the dedication and commitment of the Anza Vista neighborhood to the Project, the Board of Supervisors intends to waive fees associated with the Project. 10 (h) On July 24, 2024, Supervisor Stefani introduced a Resolution of Intent to waive 11 12 permit-related fees for this Project. The Board of Supervisors adopted, and the Mayor signed, 13 Resolution No. 446-24. A copy of this Resolution in on file with the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors in File No. 240794 and is incorporated herein by reference. 14 15 16 Section 2. Environmental and General Plan Findings. (a) On _____, the Planning Commission, in Resolution No. ____ 17 18 determined that the actions contemplated in this ordinance comply with the California 19 Environmental Quality Act (California Public Resources Code Sections 21000 et seq.). The 20 Board affirms this determination. A copy of said Resolution is on file with the Clerk of the 21 Board of Supervisors in File No. _____, and is incorporated herein by reference. (b) In Resolution No. _____, the Planning Commission also adopted findings 22

that the actions contemplated in this ordinance are consistent, on balance, with the City's

necessity findings of Planning Code Section 302. The Board adopts these findings as its own.

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1	Section 3. Waiver of Public Works Major Encroachment Permit-Related Fees and
2	Planning Code General Plan Referral Fee for the Vicha Ratanapakdee Mosaic Stairway
3	Project.
4	(a) In recognition of the benefits to the community of the Vicha Ratanapakdee Mosaic
5	Stairway Project, its symbolism of a tragic event affecting a beloved member of our
6	community, and its ability to raise awareness about hate crime and mark San Francisco's
7	solidarity in the fight against hate crime, the Board of Supervisors hereby waives the fees
8	associated with a major encroachment permit under Public Works Code Sections 786 et seq.
9	Such fees, including but not limited to those for permit processing of a Love Our
10	Neighborhoods Tier 3 project, street improvement permit, and inspection, as set forth in Public
11	Works Code Sections 2.1.1 et seq., are estimated to be approximately \$3,000 plus 7.5% of
12	the construction cost for the inspection fee.
13	(b) The Board of Supervisors also waives the Planning Code fees associated with
14	General Plan referral for a major encroachment permit that Public Works would issue in
15	accordance with Public Works Code Sections 786 et seq. This fee is estimated to be
16	approximately \$4,800.
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18	Section 4. Effective Date. This ordinance shall become effective 30 days after
19	enactment. Enactment occurs when the Mayor signs the ordinance, the Mayor returns the
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1	ordinance unsigned or does not sign the ordinance within ten days of receiving it, or the Board
2	of Supervisors overrides the Mayor's veto of the ordinance.
