County function managed by the Court

Staff the needs of the jury

Fiscal agent for jury's expenses

Budget: \$250K

Indigent Defense Administration (IDA)

- The Court appoints conflicts counsel for indigent adults and juveniles whenever the Public Defender declares a conflict of interest or is otherwise unavailable
- Justice: all persons are innocent unless proven guilty
- The accused are entitled to representation
- Guaranteed right
 U.S. Constitution, Amendment VI
 California Penal Code, Section 987
 - California Penal Code, Section 987
- FY25-26 Budget: \$10.05 million

 A CPI adjustment of almost \$250K was provided to indigent defense program.


 Beginning May 2025, about 25% of new criminal cases have been referred to "conflicts panel" due to Public Defender's unavailability.



Superior Court of California County of San Francisco

Year Over Year Comparison

BASF'S IDA program represents 25% of criminal cases due to conflict of interest with the Public Defender and 85% of these cases are felonies.



Future Cost Impact

Conflicts cases referred to the Bar have doubled since May 2025

- \circ City's 5-year monthly average = 430 cases
- \circ Bar's 5-year monthly average = 134 cases

 If PD unavailability continues, indigent defense costs will rise and exceed the 25/26 budget allocation (i.e., one-time supplemental request.)

Cost factors are end date of PD unavailability + total new criminal cases
