1	[Resolution endorsing the 2007 Immigrant Rights Summit]

3	Resolution endorsing the 2007 Immigrant Rights Summit to be convened at the Bill
4	Graham Civic Auditorium and declaring September 15, 2007 as Immigrant Rights Day
5	in the City and County of San Francisco.

7	WHEREAS, In 1989, San Francisco passed the "City of Refuge" Ordinance that
	prohibited the use of city funds to enforce federal immigration laws or to share information
8	with federal immigration officials; and,
9	WHEREAS, on January 17, 2006, the San Francisco Board of Supervisors
10	unanimously passed a resolution reaffirming the City's support for the City of Refuge
11	Ordinance; and,
12	WHEREAS, According to the 2000 US Census, immigrants comprise 36.8% of San
	Francisco's population with 61.4% from Asia, 21.2% from Latin and Central America, 13.9% from
13	Europe, and Africa, Oceania and Canada each at 1%.
14	WHEREAS, the San Francisco Immigrant Rights Commission has voted unanimously
15	to convene an Immigrant Rights Summit on September 15, 2007 at the Bill Graham Civic
16	Auditorium with the purpose of fostering a Bay Area-wide dialogue to positively impact the
17	congressional debate on immigration reform; and,
18	WHEREAS, Not since the Civil Rights Act of 1964 has a bill such before Congress
	have the potential to engender sweeping socioeconomic repercussions that will be felt for
19	several generations to come and therefore, it is becomes even more critical for policy makers
20	to heed the voices and concerns of their constituents; and
21	WHEREAS, the theme of the Immigrant Rights Summit will be "Unity, Dignity and
22	Opportunity for All Immigrants"; and,
23	WHEREAS, the purpose of the 2007 Immigrant Rights Summit is three fold: (1) draft
24	general guiding principles for a more just and humane immigration reform policy (2) develop

best practices for US Sanctuary Cities for fair treatment to all; and (3) develop analysis and
 best practices of integrating immigrants into civic and cultural life of local communities; and,

WHEREAS, San Francisco was the first American City to adopt a "Sanctuary City" ordinance in 1989 and since then, 26 other cities have adopted similar ordinances; and,

WHEREAS, the San Francisco Board of Supervisors have since reaffirmed San
Francisco as a "Sanctuary City" on multiple occasions through passage of amendments
beginning in 1999 in response to increased raids by the Immigration and Customs
Enforcement (ICE) office; and,

- WHEREAS, ICE raids have again proliferated in the Bay Area and Mayor Gavin
 Newsom has expressed great concern about the detrimental impact on local Immigrant
 communities; and,
- WHEREAS, Despite the city's reaffirmation of an official policy of non-cooperation, ICE
 officials continue to arrest, detain and deport members of the immigrant communities without
 due process, separating families, leaving behind children without parents and inflicting
 tremendous psychological and economic distress on local communities; and,
- WHEREAS, Immigrants contribute significantly to the social, economic, and cultural
 vitality of the City, but the ICE raids coupled with rising xenophobia have compromised the
 ability of immigrants to contribute meaningfully and with vigor; and,
- WHEREAS, the ability of society as a whole to fully express its potential is diminished
 when a significant segment of its population must live in fear, frustration and without due
 process; therefore, be it
- RESOLVED, that the San Francisco Board of Supervisors hereby endorses the 2007
 Immigrant Rights Summit to be convened at the Bill Graham Civic Auditorium and declares
 September 15, 2007 as Immigrant Rights Day in the City and County of San Francisco.
