[CENSUS DATA - USE OF ACCURACY AND COVERAGE EVALUATION]

URGING THE UNITED STATES CONGRESS TO SUPPORT THE USE OF FEDERAL

FUNDING FOR AN ACCURACY AND COVERAGE EVALUATION (STATISTICAL

SAMPLING) AND TO DEFEAT BILLS THAT WOULD DISALLOW SUCH USE IN ORDER

TO ENSURE A MORE ACCURATE COUNT IN THE 2000 CENSUS.

WHEREAS, On January 25, 1999, the United States Supreme Court struck down the federal government's plan to use statistical sampling in the 2000 census to determine the population for congressional apportionment purposes; and,

WHEREAS, The Supreme Court January ruling appears to continue to allow statistical sampling for purposes other than congressional apportionment, including redistricting and the way federal funds are allocated to the states; and,

WHEREAS, Statistical sampling involves visiting a randomly selected sample of households in each neighborhood and using the findings to extrapolate the size and makeup of all households in a neighborhood; and,

WHEREAS, While statistical sampling is not a perfect method, it may be used effectively as a supplement to a head count in order to make the census count more accurate, and will almost certainly add to the number of minorities and low income people who are included in the 2000 Census count; and,

WHEREAS, Minority groups and low income individuals have been historically undercounted by the census; and,

WHEREAS, The population count produced by the Census is used to distribute about \$185 billion in annual federal grants for social programs including affordable housing, welfare, health care; and,

WHEREAS, The Director of the United States Census Bureau has publicly announced that he plan to set aside money to do an accuracy and coverage evaluation (statistical sampling) in the Census 2000 count; and,

WHEREAS, There are currently federal bills pending in the United States Congress that would unduly burden the Census Bureau and make it unlikely that sampling will be used; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors of the City and County of San Francisco urges the United States Congress to allow federal census funding to be used for an accuracy and coverage evaluation (statistical sampling); and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That a copy of this resolution be forwarded to his Honor, the Mayor, with a request that he transmit copies to the delegation from California in the United States Congress and to the Chairs of the House Committee on Government Reform and Oversight, Subcommittee on the Census, the House Committee on Appropriations, Subcommittee on Commerce, Justice, State and the Judiciary, the Senate Committee on Government Affairs, and the Senate Appropriations Committee to urge their support for the use of an accuracy and coverage evaluation.
