Resolution supporting California State Senate Bill No. 417, introduced by Senator Christopher Cabaldon, and California State Assembly Bill No. 736, introduced by Assembly Member Buffy Wicks, to authorize the issuance of \$10 billion in general obligation bonds to fund affordable rental housing and homeownership programs in California.

WHEREAS, Only 17 percent of California households can afford to purchase a median priced single-family home; and

WHEREAS, Nearly half of all renter households in San Francisco are rent burdened (spending over 30 percent of their income on housing), with about a quarter being severely burdened (spending over 50 percent of their income on housing); and

WHEREAS, Approximately 8,300 people—including 2,500 San Francisco Unified School District students—are currently experiencing homelessness in San Francisco; and

WHEREAS, Across the state, housing production in the past decade has been under 100,000 units per year, with an average of 13,000 affordable housing units constructed per year in California; and

WHEREAS, San Francisco's Regional Housing Needs Allocation calls for the construction of 82,069 new units of housing by 2031, including 20,867 very low-income units and 12,014 low-income units; and

WHEREAS, San Francisco currently has 10,219 affordable units in the development pipeline, with 7,500 of those units being in new 100% affordable buildings and preservation projects; and

WHEREAS, Additional state funding would allow the City to increase the number of affordable units in the development pipeline and accelerate the construction of those units; and

WHEREAS, The Affordable Housing Bond Act of 2026 would place a bond measure on the June 2026 ballot to authorize the issuance of \$10 billion in general obligation bonds to support the construction, rehabilitation, and preservation of affordable housing and permanent supportive housing in California; and

WHEREAS, The bonds would fund critical programs—including the Multifamily Housing Program, CalHome Program, and Joe Serna, Jr. Farmworker Housing Grant Program—to create more affordable rental housing for lower-income families, homeownership opportunities, and supportive housing for people experiencing homelessness; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors of the City and County of San Francisco supports California State Senate Bill No. 417 and California State Assembly Bill No. 736, the Affordable Housing Bond Act of 2026; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors urges the California State

Legislature and the Governor to enact the Affordable Housing Bond Act of 2026 to place this
bond measure on the June 2026 ballot; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors shall transmit a copy of this Resolution to California Governor Gavin Newsom, Senate President pro Tempore Mike McGuire, Assembly Speaker Robert Rivas, Senate Housing Committee Chair Aisha Wahab, Assembly Housing and Community Development Committee Chair Matt Haney, Senator Christopher Cabaldon, Senator Scott Wiener, Assembly Member Buffy Wicks, and Assembly Member Catherine Stefani.
