

1 [Accept-Expend State Grant]

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3 **Resolution authorizing the Mayor’s Office of Criminal Justice (MOCJ) to accept and**
4 **expend funds in the amount of \$2,294,774 from the State Corrections Standards**
5 **Authority (CSA), from funds made available under Senate Bill 736 – known as the**
6 **Juvenile Justice Crime Prevention Act (JJCPA) – for programs and approaches that**
7 **have been demonstrated to be effective in reducing delinquency, for the period of July**
8 **1, 2008 to June 30, 2009.**

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10 WHEREAS, MOCJ is the lead programmatic and fiscal agency of the county in
11 administering JJCPA, which provides funds for the county to implement a comprehensive,
12 multi-agency juvenile justice plan; and

13 WHEREAS, the JJCPA requires that the county’s local Juvenile Justice Coordinating
14 Council, whose membership is described in Section 749.22 of the Welfare and Institutions
15 Code, update its Comprehensive Multi-agency Juvenile Justice Plan (also know as its
16 Juvenile Justice Local Action Plan) and develop an annual expenditure plan for JJCPA funds;
17 and

18 WHEREAS, JJCPA also requires that the county Board of Supervisors, and in the case
19 of a city and county the Mayor, approve the updated Comprehensive Multi-agency Juvenile
20 Justice Plan and the JJCPA expenditure plan; and

21 WHEREAS, the City originally established the Juvenile Justice Coordinating Council
22 through resolution 170-97; and

23 WHEREAS, the Chief Probation Officer, William P. Siffermann, serves as chair of the
24 Juvenile Justice Coordinating Council as required by JJCPA and Section 749.22 of the
25 Welfare and Institutions Code; and

1 WHEREAS, on March 31, 2008 the Juvenile Justice Coordinating Council met and
2 recommended to the Board of Supervisors the updated Comprehensive Multi-agency Juvenile
3 Justice Plan and the expenditure plan for the 2008 allocation of the JJCPA grant;

4 WHEREAS, the grant does not require an ASO amendment; and

5 WHEREAS, the grant budget includes a provision for indirect costs of \$11,474 (the
6 maximum amount allowed by the state); now, therefore be it

7 RESOLVED, that the City and County of San Francisco hereby authorizes MOCJ to
8 accept and expend \$2,294,774 from the State Corrections Standards Authority under JJCPA
9 for programs and approaches that have been demonstrated to be effective in reducing
10 delinquency; and

11 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, all interest earned and prior year unencumbered funds
12 of this grant is appropriated to support approved 2008 JJCPA programs;

13 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the County assures that the Board of Supervisors
14 has reviewed and approves the county's update to the Comprehensive Multi-agency Juvenile
15 Justice Plan; and

16 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Violence Prevention Director of the Mayor's
17 Office of Criminal Justice is authorized to sign the application for approval submitted to the
18 Corrections Standards Authority; and

19 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the City and County of San Francisco assures that it
20 has adhered to the requirements of JJCPA and of the Corrections Standards Authority
21 regarding the submission of the plan; and

22 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the plan has been developed and provided to the
23 Corrections Standards Authority in a format determined by the Corrections Standards
24 Authority regarding submission of the Plan; and

1 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the City and County of San Francisco, upon
2 approval from the Corrections Standards Authority, will adhere to the requirements of the
3 JJCPA regarding the expenditure of JJCPA funds and the submission of required Corrections
4 Standards Authority reports; and

5 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Controller is directed to designate the position
6 funded under this agreement as a "G" or grant-funded position which would terminate when
7 the agreement expires.
