11 Ollie Bryant, Jr., vice Melanie DewBerry, (Seat No. 5, must have
12 interest in/knowledgeable of Juvenile delinquency, for unexpired
13 portion of term ending December 31, 1998, a new 4-year term ending
14 December 31, 2002.

15 Ernest Lira, vice James Howard, (Seat No. 6, must have interest
16 in/knowledgeable of Juvenile delinquency, for unexpired portion of
17 term ending December 31, 1998, a new 4-year term ending December 31,
18 2002.

19 Benson Wong, vice Andante Higgins, (Seat No. 12, must be nominee
20 of Supervisor Ammiano), unexpired portion of 4-year term ending
21 December 31, 2000.

22 Vin Courtney, vice Eric Quezada, (Seat No. 14, must be nominee
23 of Supervisor Medina), unexpired portion of 4-year term ending
24 December 31, 2000;

4 FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors makes the
5 following findings:

- 6 1. The membership of the Delinquency Prevention Commission has a
7 goal to be representative of the diversity of the City and
8 County of San Francisco.
- 9 2. Applicant Ernest Lira, a new appointee, who is not a resident
10 of San Francisco, but works for Horizon Unlimited in San
11 Francisco as an outreach and prevention worker in Middle
12 Schools and High Schools. He also works with youth in Log
13 Cabin Ranch. Mr. Lira is a person with 25 years of
14 experience that uniquely qualifies him to serve on the
15 Delinquency Prevention Commission.
- 16 3. The Delinquency Prevention Commission has attempted to fill
17 the position, for which Ernest Lira was nominated, with an
18 individual who is a City resident and who has the specific
19 experience, skills, and qualifications, but has been unable
20 to do so at this time. The Rules Committee has certified
21 that Ernest Lira is qualified to serve on the Delinquency
22 Prevention Commission.
- 23 4. After exercising due diligence, the Board of Supervisors
24 concludes that there is no other possible representative, who
25 is a resident of San Francisco and who has the specific

1 experience, skills, or qualifications possessed by this
2 applicant, and who is willing to serve on the Delinquency
3 Prevention Commission at this time; and, be it

4 FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors waives the
5 residency requirement for Ernest Lira, as allowed in cases where no
6 qualified City resident, willing to serve, can be found, pursuant to
7 Section 4.101 of the City Charter that requires person(s) appointed
8 to boards, commissions, and advisory bodies established by
9 legislative act of the Board of Supervisors to be resident(s) of the
10 City and County of San Francisco.
