Ernest Lira, vice James Howard, (Seat No. 6, must have interest in/knowledgeable of Juvenile delinquency, for unexpired portion of term ending December 31, 1998, a new 4-year term ending December 31, 2002.

Benson Wong, vice Andante Higgins, (Seat No. 12, must be nominee of Supervisor Ammiano), unexpired portion of 4-year term ending December 31, 2000.

Vin Courtney, vice Eric Quezada, (Seat No. 14, must be nominee of Supervisor Medina), unexpired portion of 4-year term ending December 31, 2000; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors makes the following findings:

- The membership of the Delinquency Prevention Commission has a goal to be representative of the diversity of the City and County of San Francisco.
- 2. Applicant Ernest Lira, a new appointee, who is not a resident of San Francisco, but works for Horizon Unlimited in San Francisco as an outreach and prevention worker in Middle Schools and High Schools. He also works with youth in Log Cabin Ranch. Mr. Lira is a person with 25 years of experience that uniquely qualifies him to serve on the Delinquency Prevention Commission.
- 3. The Delinquency Prevention Commission has attempted to fill the position, for which Ernest Lira was nominated, with an individual who is a City resident and who has the specific experience, skills, and qualifications, but has been unable to do so at this time. The Rules Committee has certified that Ernest Lira is qualified to serve on the Delinquency Prevention Commission.
- 4. After exercising due diligence, the Board of Supervisors concludes that there is no other possible representative, who is a resident of San Francisco and who has the specific

experience, skills, or qualifications possessed by this applicant, and who is willing to serve on the Delinquency Prevention Commission at this time; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors waives the residency requirement for Ernest Lira, as allowed in cases where no qualified City resident, willing to serve, can be found, pursuant to Section 4.101 of the City Charter that requires person(s) appointed to boards, commissions, and advisory bodies established by legislative act of the Board of Supervisors to be resident(s) of the City and County of San Francisco.
