Contract for approval

In August 2023, DCYF issued a Request for Proposals (RFP) for the 2024-2029 funding cycle.

The contract with Japanese Community Youth Council (JCYC) for the Mayor's Youth Employment and Education Program (MYEEP), SF STEM Academy and Japantown Youth Leaders requires Board approval, as the not to exceed amount is over \$10M.

File 240645 – July 1, 2024- June 30, 2029, with a not to exceed amount of \$40,386,800

MYEEP

- Serves 9th -10th graders
- 900 unduplicated youth served each year
- The first semester is job readiness training, and youth receive a stipend
- The second semester is job placement where youth are placed in CBO's and local businesses and receive a wage
- During the summer, the program is open to all high school students, and includes ten hours of job readiness training and 140 hours of employment, per participant
- Annual allocation of \$6,335,000

Note: HRC is seeking approval for a separate contract with JCYC for OFA-YW today.

SF STEM and Young Leaders

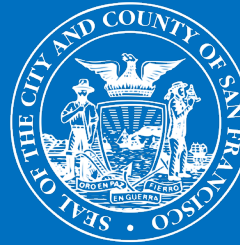
SF STEM:

- 20 Balboa students are provided with workshops and trainings on STEM-related topics, as well as fieldtrips and enrichment activities, and one-on-one check-ins.
- During the summer, participants are placed in a summer internship in a STEM related field.
- The program serves 20 unduplicated clients annually.
- Annual Allocation of \$300,000

Japantown Young Leaders:

- Service-learning projects, trainings and other program activities to promote leadership and team building.
- Students teach service-learning skills to elementary and middle-school aged children in JCYC's summer camp.
- The program serves 50 unduplicated clients annually.
- Annual Allocation of \$300,000
