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3	Ordinance amending the Park Code to 1) reduce the number of seats on the Parks,
4	Recreation, and Open Space Advisory Committee (PROSAC), to 2) provide for alternate
5	members, and to 3) allow members to serve for more than four consecutive terms, 4)
6	provide for the appointment of members having experience with environmental justice
7	and racial equity and disability issues; and 5) provide that meetings shall occur at City
8	<u>Hall</u> .

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15	Be it ordained by the People of the City and County of San Francisco:
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17	Section 1. Article 13 of the Park Code is hereby amended by revising Section 13.01, to
18	read as follows:
19	SEC. 13.01. CITIZENS' ADVISORY COMMITTEE.
20	(a) Membership. Effective September 1, 2023, the There is hereby established a The
21	Park, Recreation and Open Space Advisory Committee ("Committee") shall be comprised of
22	1312twenty-three voting members. Eleven Twenty-two members shall be appointed by the
23	members of the Board of Supervisors and approved by the full Board, with one member
24	appointed by each Supervisor from their his or her supervisorial district; and each Supervisor shall
25	also appoint from their supervisorial district a specific alternate for the regular voting member, subject

1	to approval by the full Board. The alternates shall not be seated on the Committee, but if a regular
2	voting member is unavailable to attend or unable to vote as a result of recusal, then that regular
3	voting member's specific alternate shall be seated and shall act in the place of the regular voting
4	member. Alternates are encouraged expected to attend and participate as nonvoting members
5	in meetings of the Committee. The Mayor shall appoint one member of the Committee, who shall
6	be a City resident. The President of the Board of Supervisors shall appoint one additional
7	member of the Committeewho represents an environmental justice organization based in San
8	Francisco, subject to approval by the Board of Supervisors. The Committee members shall all be
9	City residents and shall have relevant experience with and one member appointed by each
10	Supervisor from a list, maintained by the Recreation and Park Commission ("Commission") of
11	individuals nominated by organizations having as a primary focus park, environmental,
12	recreational, cultural, sports, youth, disability, racial equity, or senior citizen issues. Where a
13	voting seat that is subject to appointment by a Supervisor is vacant for more than 30 days, the
14	Committee shall advise the appointing Supervisor of the vacancy. If the vacancy is not filled
15	within 30 days of transmission of the notice of vacancy to the appointing Supervisor, the
16	President shall appoint a member to the vacant seat, subject to approval by the Board of
17	Supervisors, and shall become the member's appointing authority for the remainder of the
18	member's term, at the end of which the authority to appoint a member to the seat shall revert
19	back to the appointing SupervisorFour of the members chosen from the list maintained by the
20	Commission shall be individuals nominated by an environmental organization. If the system of district
21	elections set forth in Charter Section 13.110 is discontinued, each Supervisor shall appoint one
22	member of the Committee from the list maintained by the Commission and one member without
23	restriction. One member of the Committee shall be appointed by the Mayor.
24	(b) <b>Terms.</b> The Committee members shall serve <u>at the pleasure of their appointing</u>
25	authority for terms of two years, at the will of the appointing authority, except that at the first

1	meeting of the Committee the General Manager of the Recreation and Park Department
2	("Department") shall, by lot, designate twelve members to serve terms of one year. Thereafter, all
3	members shall be appointed to two-year terms and no member shall serve more than four consecutive
4	terms.

- (c) **Transition Period.** Prior to September 1, 2023, the Committee shall adopt a transition roster that identifies which of the current Board-appointed members shall serve as regular voting members versus as alternates. Where there are already two members appointed by the same Supervisor, those members shall attempt to reach agreement as to which of them shall be the regular voting member and which of them shall be the alternate, before September 1, 2023, subject to approval of the Committee; but if they do not agree, then the Committee may designate their assignments by lot. The Committee's adoption of a transition roster shall not impact the authority of the Mayor or Board of Supervisors to fill vacancies or reassign which members serve as regular voting members and alternates. The term of the Presidential appointee shall begin on September 1, 2023. From the effective date of Proposition C, which appeared on the March 7, 2000 ballot and until January 31, 2001, the Open Space Advisory Committee created by former Charter Section 16.107 shall serve as the Committee created in section (a) above. During this transition period the Open Space Advisory Committee shall take all steps necessary to ensure a smooth transition to the new Committee. The Mayor and the members of the Board of Supervisors may fill vacancies on the Committee that occur during this transition period according to the requirements of former Administrative Code Section 590(a). By July 1, 2000, the Commission shall prepare, and the Board of Supervisors shall approve or modify, a list of organizations qualified to nominate individuals for Committee membership. Changes to the list shall be made by the Commission and approved or modified by the Board of Supervisors annually. The Board of Supervisors and the Mayor shall make their first appointments to the Committee by February 1, 2001.
  - (d) **Duties.** The Committee shall have the following duties:

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2	(5) The Committee shall hold meetings at least once a month in City Hall and shall
3	adopt its own rules of procedure.
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6	Section 23. Effective Date. This ordinance shall become effective 30 days after
7	enactment. Enactment occurs when the Mayor signs the ordinance, the Mayor returns the
8	ordinance unsigned or does not sign the ordinance within ten days of receiving it, or the Board
9	of Supervisors overrides the Mayor's veto of the ordinance.
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11	Section 34. Scope of Ordinance. In enacting this ordinance, the Board of Supervisors
12	intends to amend only those words, phrases, paragraphs, subsections, sections, articles,
13	numbers, punctuation marks, charts, diagrams, or any other constituent parts of the Municipal
14	Code that are explicitly shown in this ordinance as additions, deletions, Board amendment
15	additions, and Board amendment deletions in accordance with the "Note" that appears under
16	the official title of the ordinance.
