| 9 | followed specific required procedures; and |
| 10 | WHEREAS, On July 18, 2002, the California Supreme Court ruled, "The possession |
| 11 | and cultivation of marijuana is no more criminal so long as [the law's] conditions are |
| 12 | satisfied than the possession and acquisition of any prescription drug with a physician's |
| 13 | prescription;" and |
| 14 | WHEREAS, States like California that passed medical marijuana referenda must be |
| 15 | accountable for implementing the voters' will; and |
| 16 | WHEREAS, thousands of seriously and critically ill patients who currently rely on safe |
| 17 | access to medical marijuana in 8 States that allow it are under threat of Federal arrest and |
| 18 | prosecution; and |
| 19 | WHEREAS, On September 6th, 1988, after 16 years of court battles, the DEA's chief |
| 20 | administrative law judge, Francis L. Young, ruled: "Marijuana, in its natural form, is one of the |
| 21 | safest therapeutically active substances known [T]he provisions of the [Controlled |
| 22 | Substances] Act permit and require the transfer of marijuana from Schedule I to Schedule II. |
| 23 | It would be unreasonable, arbitrary and capricious for DEA to continue to stand between |
| 24 | those sufferers and the benefits of this substance;" and |

| 3 | WHEREAS, The Institute of Medicine's 1999 report on medical marijuana |
| 4 | commissioned by the White House states, "The accumulated data indicate a potential |
| 5 | therapeutic value for cannabinoid drugs, particularly for symptoms such as pain relief, control |
| 6 | of nausea and vomiting, and appetite stimulation;" and |
| 7 | WHEREAS, The voters that passed Proposition 215 have been given confusing and |
| 8 | inaccurate information by the DEA and the ONDCP in order to lessen the critique of DEA |
| 9 | raids that threaten the safe access by seriously ill patients of the medical marijuana |
| 10 | recommended by their physicians; and |
| 11 | WHEREAS, Voters deserve to know accurate and clear information on who uses and |
| 12 | benefits from the use of marijuana as medicine; now, therefore, be it |
| 13 | RESOLVED, That the San Francisco Board of Supervisors designates February 15 |
| 14 | through 22, 2003 as Medical Marijuana Awareness Week. |
