WHEREAS, Ross Shoaf researched traffic safety and vehicle flow patterns to bring about for adoption the yellow traffic stripe as a national standard designating traffic flow in opposite directions; and,

WHEREAS, Ross Shoaf completed his career as the Assistant City Engineer in 1972, only to be elected to serve as the International President of the Institute of Traffic Engineers; now, therefore, be it
