WHEREAS, Black and White Men Together expanded to over 27 chapters nationwide and was instrumental in raising awareness of the AIDS crisis and the dire need for prevention education to the mainstream of African American community; and

WHEREAS, Reggie was invited by the National Southern Christian Leadership

Conference, the Urban League, and the Black Caucus to address AIDS crisis in the African

American community; and

WHEREAS, Reggie Williams emigrated to Amsterdam, Netherlands because his lover, Wolfgang Schreiber was denied entry to United States because of his positive HIV status; and
