AUTHORIZING THE CITY AND COUNTY OF SAN FRANCISCO TO ENTER AN APPLICATION FOR THE 1999 CSAC CHALLENGE AWARDS COMPETITION FOR THE SAN FRANCISCO CHILD CARE FACILITIES FUND (CCFF).

WHEREAS, the California State Association of Counties (CSAC) is sponsoring the CSAC Challenge Awards Program, which recognizes the innovative and creative spirit of California county governments for finding new and effective ways of providing services to their residents; and

WHEREAS, the Child Care Facilities Fund (CCFF) is an innovative partnership among the City, the Miriam and Peter Haas Fund, Providian Financial Corporation, child care providers, parents and many others dedicated to supporting working families in San Francisco; and

WHEREAS, the mission of the CCFF is to expand the supply and improve the quality of child care available to low income families by offering grants, loans and technical assistance to family child care providers and child care centers located in San Francisco to make capital improvements; and

WHEREAS, San Francisco families -- especially those affected by welfare reform -- need access to high quality child care in order to go to work and in order for their children to be safe and to flourish; and

WHEREAS, the CCFF is administered by the Low Income Housing Fund (CCFF), a national nonprofit leader in lending to community facilities who recently received the local "Partners in Community Development Award" as part of the Community Development Block Grant 25th anniversary celebration for their participation in this partnership; and

WHEREAS, since its inception in January 1998, the CCFF has created more than three hundred new child care slots and has improved the quality of care for thousands of children; and

WHEREAS, in the long term, through its programs, the CCFF will help more than sixteen hundred families transition from welfare to work, create more than three thousand new child care slots, and increase the fiscal health and stability of the child care sector; and

WHEREAS, the CCFF is an excellent example of a creative, county-level partnership that is generating new revenues and coordinating existing resources to improve services to families; and

WHEREAS, the City and County of San Francisco desires to participate in the 1999 Challenge Awards Program and agrees to the program's requirements and responsibilities as set forth by CSAC for entering the awards program, including submitting the application by June 25, 1999; now, therefore

BE IT RESOLVED, that the Board of Supervisors of the City and County of San Francisco authorizes the President of the Board of Supervisors or his designee to submit an application to CSAC for the Challenge Awards competition for the Child Care Facilities Fund (CCFF).
