- 3. The Rules Committee has certified that Walter Johnson is qualified to serve on the Living Wage Task Force.
- 4. After exercising due diligence, the Board of Supervisors concludes that there is no other possible representative, who is a resident of San Francisco and who has the specific experience, skills, or qualifications possessed by this applicant, and who is willing to serve on the Living Wage Task Force at this time; and, be it
