2 APPOINTING MEMBERS TO THE LIVING WAGE TASK FORCE; WAIVING RESIDENCY
3 REQUIREMENT.

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5 RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors of the City and County
6 of San Francisco does hereby appoint the hereinafter designated
7 persons to serve as members of the Living Wage Task Force, pursuant
8 to the provisions of Board of Supervisors Resolution No. 991-98, for
9 the term specified:

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11 NaNoshka Johnson, (Seat No. 12, must represent a small, medium
12 or large business that contracts with the City), for a new term
13 ending July 11, 1999.

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15 Robert O'Malley, (Seat No. 13, must represent low-income workers
16 from non-profits or businesses that contract with the City), for a
17 new term ending July 11, 1999.

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19 Alina Laguna, (Seat No. 14, must represent non-profit
20 organizations that contract with the City), for a new term ending
21 July 11, 1999.

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Walter Johnson, (Seat No. 15, must represent organized labor
~~non-profit~~
~~organizations that contract with the City~~), for a new term ending
July 11, 1999; and, be it

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2 FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Board of Supervisors makes the
3 following findings:

4 1. The membership of the Living Wage Task Force has a goal to be
5 representative of the diversity of the City and County of San
6 Francisco.

7 2. Applicant Walter Johnson, a new appointee, who is not a
8 resident of San Francisco, is a person with experience that
9 uniquely qualifies him to serve on the Living Wage Task
10 Force.

11 3. The Living Wage Task Force has attempted to fill the
12 position, for which Walter Johnson was nominated, with an
13 individual who is a City resident and who has the specific
14 experience, skills, and qualifications, but has been unable
15 to do so at this time. The Rules Committee has certified
16 that Walter Johnson is qualified to serve on the Living Wage
17 Task Force.

18 4. After exercising due diligence, the Board of Supervisors
19 concludes that there is no other possible representative, who
20 is a resident of San Francisco and who has the specific
21 experience, skills, or qualifications possessed by this
22 applicant, and who is willing to serve on the Living Wage
23 Task Force at this time; and, be it
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1 FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors waives the
2 residency requirement for Walter Johnson, as allowed in cases where
3 no qualified City resident, willing to serve, can be found, pursuant
4 to Section 4.101 of the City Charter that requires persons appointed
5 to boards, commissions, and advisory bodies established by
6 legislative act of the Board of Supervisors to be residents of the
7 City and County of San Francisco.


