

1 [Increasing fee for Educational Institution Permits and authorizing exemption from Residential
2 Parking Permit regulations for itinerant School District teachers and administrators.]

3 **Ordinance amending the San Francisco Traffic Code by amending section 308.3 to (1)**
4 **increase the annual fee for Educational Institution Permits for teachers by tying the fee**
5 **to the cost of Residential Parking permits issued to residents; and (2) authorize the**
6 **Director of Parking and Traffic to issue permits that would exempt itinerant teachers**
7 **and designated school administrators employed by the San Francisco Unified School**
8 **District from Residential Permit Parking regulations.**

12 Be it ordained by the People of the City and County of San Francisco:

13 Section 1. The San Francisco Traffic Code is hereby amended by amending Section
14 308.3, to read as follows:

15 **SEC. 308.3. EDUCATIONAL INSTITUTION PERMITS.**

16 (a) Upon written request, the Director of Parking and Traffic shall issue to the
17 principal or chief administrator of an educational institution located within a residential permit
18 parking area transferable daytime parking permits for the use of persons employed as
19 teachers at such institution who operate commuter vehicles, which permits would be valid for
20 parking between the hours of 8:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m.

21 (b) The Director of Parking and Traffic is authorized to issue a maximum of ten ~~10~~
22 and a minimum of three annual parking permits per institution, or the number of parking permits
23 that equals the number of on-street unrestricted parking spaces available between an
24 extension of each property line of said institution to the middle of the public streets or

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1 highways upon which the institution directly abuts, as determined by survey of the Department
2 of Public Works, whichever is the lesser number, but in no event less than three permits.

3 (c) Each parking permit issued by the Director of Parking and Traffic pursuant to this
4 Section shall be valid for one year from the date established by the Director of Parking and
5 Traffic. Permits may be repurchased annually upon reapplication by the principal or chief
6 administrator of the educational institution in the manner required by the Director of Parking
7 and Traffic. In dispensing of the permits for a particular educational institution, the principal or
8 chief administrator thereof shall give consideration to those teachers who are participating in a
9 carpool or other method of transportation. The fee for issuance of each permit provided for in
10 this Section shall be consistent with the annual permit fee established in Section 314(e)~~-\$21~~
11 ~~regardless of the date of purchase or repurchase.~~

12 (d) In addition to permits issued under subsection (a), the Director of Parking and Traffic may
13 issue city-wide permits for those itinerant teachers and designated school administrators employed by
14 the San Francisco Unified School District (SFUSD) whose duties require them to travel to more than
15 one school site and who have been approved by the Superintendent of the SFUSD, or his or her
16 designee. For purposes of this section, "designated school administrators" shall be defined as those
17 administrators who provide on-site, direct support to schools that have been identified as low-
18 performing by SFUSD, the State of California, or the Federal government. The permit shall exempt the
19 holder from residential parking area regulations on weekdays between the hours of 8 a.m. to 5 p.m.
20 when performing official functions for the School District. Such permits shall be valid for one year
21 from date of issuance and shall be subject to an annual fee consistent with the annual permit fee
22 established in Section 314(e). The Director of Parking and Traffic shall also issue rules and
23 regulations, not inconsistent with this Article, governing issuance and the manner in which approved
24 personnel may qualify for such permits and establishing penalties for misuse of the permits.

1 ~~(d)~~(e) The term “educational institution” shall mean any school or other place of
2 learning providing a pre-school, elementary or secondary level of study, and which regularly
3 employs a staff of at least 15 certificated employees or persons regularly employed as
4 classroom teachers.
