6 MOVED, That pursuant to Section 540 of the Municipal Elections Code, the Board
7 of Supervisors does hereby authorize a rebuttal argument to opponent's ballot argument
8 against Proposition C, a Charter amendment (Third Draft) repealing in its entirety Section
9 16.107, which creates a Park and Open Space Fund and by adopting, in its place a new
10 Section 16.107 which creates a Park, Recreation and Open Space Fund, authorizes the
11 issuance of revenue bonds for acquisition and/or improvement of real properties, and
12 provides a framework for future improvements in the operations of the Recreation and Park
13 Department; and, be it

15 FURTHER MOVED, That the full text of said argument hereby authorized be shown
16 in the copy attached to this motion and is hereby declared to be a part hereof; and, be it

17 FURTHER MOVED, That the Director of Elections be and is hereby authorized and
18 directed to include said argument in the pamphlet accompanying the sample ballots to be
19 mailed to the voters of the City and County of San Francisco for the election to be held on
20 Tuesday, March 7, 2000.
