3	Resolution endorsing the Tenderloin Community Action Plan (TCAP) Investment
4	Blueprint as the community-led strategy to support equitable recovery and
5	revitalization in the Tenderloin, and encouraging City Departments, philanthropic, and
6	private sector partners to use the TCAP Investment Blueprint as a guiding framework

9	WHEREAS, The Tenderloin is a unique neighborhood with diverse cultures, the highest
10	density of children in San Francisco, and high concentrations of communities of color, seniors,
11	people with disabilities, artists, immigrants, LGBTQ+ individuals, and community-based
12	organizations and merchants; and
13	WHEREAS, The Tenderloin has long faced systemic challenges including poverty,
14	drug-related harm, and housing insecurity conditions exacerbated by historic underinvestment
15	and the COVID-19 pandemic; and
16	WHEREAS, For over a decade, the Planning Department has partnered with
17	Tenderloin residents and community organizations to advance grassroots solutions and a
18	shared vision for neighborhood revitalization; and
19	WHEREAS, In response to community advocacy following the 2021 assault of a
20	Tenderloin student, then Mayor London Breed approved \$4,000,000 in June 2022, for
21	community-driven projects to improve neighborhood safety and vibrancy; and
22	WHEREAS, The Planning Department launched a first-of-its-kind participatory
23	budgeting process, resulting in 1,400 residents and workers voting to fund 21 projects in
24	Community Wellness, Public Space Activation, Youth Investments, Small Business Support,
25	and more; and

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1	WHEREAS, These efforts culminated in the TCAP Investment Blueprint, developed by
2	Planning in partnership with community-based organizations, including GLIDE, Tenderloin
3	Community Benefit District, Tenderloin Neighborhood Development Corporation, and St.
4	Anthony's Foundation; and
5	WHEREAS, The Blueprint reflects extensive community input from neighborhood
6	organizations, service providers, and residents through surveys, town halls, focus groups, and
7	organized group meetings; and
8	WHEREAS, The TCAP Investment Blueprint establishes community-informed priorities
9	across seven thematic areas: Street Stewardship and Cleanliness, Elimination of Open-Air
10	Drug Trade and Use, Public Space Improvements and Activation, Youth Investment, Services
11	for Community Wellness, Small Business Support, and Housing Stability; and
12	WHEREAS, The Planning Commission heard the TCAP Impact Report and Investment
13	Blueprint on November 14, 2024, and expressed strong support for its findings, emphasizing
14	the importance of youth investment, safe public spaces, and sustained funding for
15	neighborhood recovery; and
16	WHEREAS, The TCAP Investment Blueprint serves as a comprehensive, equity-
17	centered roadmap to align City action with the lived experiences and priorities of Tenderloin
18	residents and community stakeholders; now, therefore, be it
19	RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors of the City and County of San Francisco
20	hereby endorses the Tenderloin Community Action Plan Investment Blueprint as the
21	community-led strategy to support equitable recovery and revitalization in the Tenderloin; and,

24	agencies to align their policies, investments, and implementation strategies with the
25	Blueprint's priorities; and, be it
