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5	WHEREAS, The University of California at San Francisco enjoys its non-profit
6	status in the City and County of San Francisco; and,
7	WHEREAS, The University of California at San Francisco should offer good jobs
8	to all sectors of the San Francisco community; and,
9	WHEREAS, The University of California appropriated 2.4 million dollars in
10	Medical Center profits to Executive Bonuses; and,
11	WHEREAS, The University of California at San Francisco awarded Mark Laret,
12	CEO UCSF Medical Center a \$74, 495 bonus in addition to his salary of \$434,400;
13	and,
14	WHEREAS, The University of California at San Francisco awarded Theodore
15	Schrock, Chief Medical Officer, Associate Dean of the School of Medicine, a \$62,599
16	bonus in addition to his salary of \$355,300; and,
17	WHEREAS, The University of California at San Francisco awarded Tomi Ryba,
18	Chief Operating Officer a \$62,178 bonus in addition to her salary of \$355,300; and,
19	WHEREAS, 48% of single adult service workers at University of California at
20	San Francisco do not meet the San Francisco County Self-Sufficiency Standard; and,
21	WHEREAS, 100% of single parent service workers at University of California at
22	San Francisco do not meet the San Francisco County Self-Sufficiency Standard; and,
23	WHEREAS, The University of California at San Francisco refuses to guarantee
24	raises for the next three years for many of its workers; and, WHEREAS, The University
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1	of California at San Francisco should treat all of its workers with dignity and respect;
2	and,
3	WHEREAS, The University of California at San Francisco should prioritize fair
4	wages and advancement opportunities over extreme executive bonuses; now,
5	therefore, be it
6	RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors of the City and County of San
7	Francisco urges the University of California at San Francisco to treat its workers with
8	the same dignity and respect as the institution affords its executives; and, be it
9	FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors urges the University of
10	California at San Francisco, a public institution, to prioritize fair distribution of its
11	resources to all of its workers.
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
