3 **Resolution urging the California Legislature to adopt Assembly Bill 32- The California**
4 **Global Warming Solutions Act of 2006.**

6 WHEREAS, The California Global Warming Solutions Act of 2006, Assembly Bill 32
7 authored by Speaker Fabian Nunez and Assemblymember Fran Pavley is considered one of
8 the most significant environmental measures in the State Legislature this year; and

9 WHEREAS, AB 32 will allow the Air Resources Board (ARB) to track greenhouse gas
10 emissions and cut emissions over time with enforceable limits beginning in 2012; and,

11 WHEREAS, With the passage this measure, statewide greenhouse gas emissions
12 would be required to be cut to 1990 levels by 2020; and,

13 WHEREAS, This measure would require the ARB to “distribute the costs and benefits
14 of the program, including emission allowances, in a manner that is equitable, maximizes the
15 total benefit to the economy, does not disproportionately burden low and moderate-income
16 households”; and,

17 WHEREAS, On May 11th, 2006, the Legislative Committee of the Bay Area Quality
18 Management District found that this measure is consistent with the District’s policies on
19 greenhouse gas emissions and voted to recommend that BAAQMD support this measure;
20 and; now, therefore be it

21 RESOLVED, That the San Francisco Board of Supervisors hereby urge the California
22 State Legislature to pass the California Global Warming Solutions Act of 2006; and, be it,

23 FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Clerk of the Board shall send this resolution to the
24 offices of Assemblyman Mark Leno, Assemblyman Leland Yee, Senator Carole Migden, and
25 Senator Jackie Speier.
