URGING THE RECREATION AND PARKS DEPARTMENT TO EXECUTE REPAIRS ON THE PALACE OF FINE ARTS' ROTUNDA WITH ALL DELIBERATE SPEED; TO DEVELOP A LONG-RANGE CONSERVATION AND MAINTENANCE PLAN FOR THIS AREA AND TO REPORT BACK TO THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS.

WHEREAS, The Palace of Fine Arts, designed to resemble ruins by renowned architect Bernard Maybeck, was constructed in 1915, as part of the Panama Pacific International Exposition; and,

WHEREAS, The Palace, first constructed of burlap, plaster and wire, was reconstructed in the more resilient cement in the mid-1960's from molds of the original structure; and,

WHEREAS, The Palace, under jurisdiction of the Recreation and Parks Department, has been a popular community gathering spot for weddings, picnics, photographs, and general enjoyment; and,

WHEREAS, It houses the Exploratorium and Palace of Fine Arts Theater, both community cultural resources; and,

WHEREAS, As a result of heavy rains associated with El Nino, the Palace rotunda has been in disrepair causing it to be sealed off from the public with a wire cyclone fence since late February of 1998; and,

WHEREAS, Repairs to the rotunda are estimated to cost \$50,000; and,

WHEREAS, Residents who live near the palace have complained about the murky and decaying condition of the lagoon; and,

WHEREAS, Recreation and Parks Department have applied to Federal Emergency Management Agency for funds to repair the footpaths, which are caving into the lagoon; and,

WHEREAS, Given the high volume of public traffic, everyday maintenance of trash around the grounds is a demanding task, often leading to garbage overflow; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors urges the Recreation and Parks Department to execute necessary repairs on the Palace rotunda with all deliberate speed; and, be it SUPERVISORS
