4 **transportation projects by authorizing the Municipal Transportation Agency and the**
5 **Department of Public Works to enter into and amend expedite contracts without**
6 **adhering to by waiving application of the Environment Code or to and provisions**
7 **relating to competitive bidding, equal benefits, local business enterprise utilization,**
8 **and other requirements, for construction work and professional and other services**
9 **relating to Vision Zero projects, for a period of three years.**

18 Be it ordained by the People of the City and County of San Francisco:

19
20 Section 1. Article IV of Chapter 6 of the Administrative Code is hereby amended by
21 adding Section 6.78, to read as follows:

22 **SEC 6.78. PUBLIC WORKS ADDRESSING VISION ZERO.**

23 *(a) In 2014, the City adopted Vision Zero—a plan to eliminate traffic deaths and reduce severe*
24 *traffic injuries—as a citywide commitment to build better and safer streets, educate the public on traffic*
25 *safety, enforce traffic laws, and adopt policy changes that save lives. The intent of this Section 6.78 is*
to strengthen Vision Zero by expediting the procurement of professional design, construction, and other
services supporting Vision Zero. It is further the intent of this Section to improve the capacity of the

1 Municipal Transportation Agency and the Department of Public Works to collaborate and utilize the
2 strengths and efficiencies of each department to the greatest extent possible to ensure that projects
3 supporting Vision Zero are completed expeditiously.

4 (b) The Municipal Transportation Agency and the Department of Public Works are authorized
5 to enter into and/or amend any contract for any Public Work or Improvement, including any
6 professional services for a Public Work or Improvement, without adherence to the requirements of this
7 Chapter 6, Administrative Code Chapter 14B, Labor and Employment Code Article 131, and the
8 Environment Code; provided, however, that the Department Head has determined in writing that the
9 Public Work or Improvement is for the construction, repair, or improvement of public facilities with a
10 primary purpose of implementing Vision Zero. By no later than August 15, 2025, and every year
11 thereafter, the departments shall submit to the Board of Supervisors, the Clerk of the Board of
12 Supervisors, and the Controller a report listing all projects procured under this Section 6.78
13 including a description of the projects' scope of work, and the total project contract amount for
14 the prior fiscal year.

15 (c) This Section 6.78 shall expire by operation of law three years from its effective date. Upon
16 expiration of this Section 6.78, the City Attorney is authorized to cause this Section to be removed from
17 the Administrative Code.

18
19 Section 2. Effective Date. This ordinance shall become effective 30 days after
20 enactment. Enactment occurs when the Mayor signs the ordinance, the Mayor returns the
21 ordinance unsigned or does not sign the ordinance within ten days of receiving it, or the Board
22 of Supervisors overrides the Mayor's veto of the ordinance.

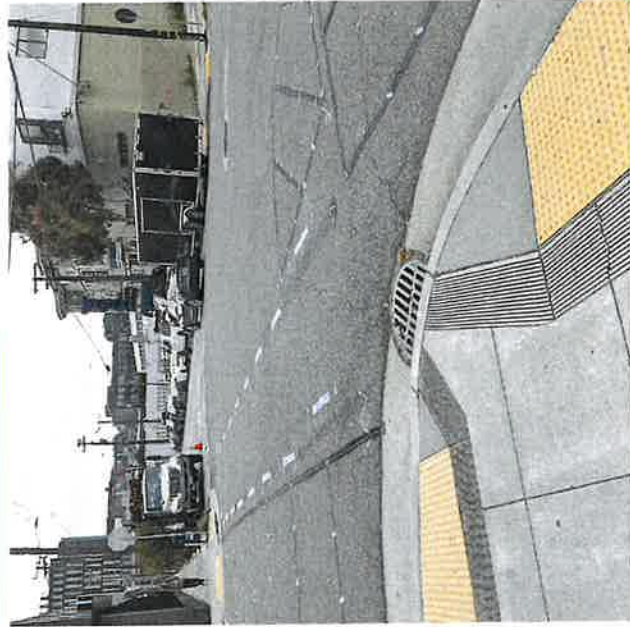

17th Street Quick-Build Project

The 17th Street Quick-Build Project was approved by the San Francisco Municipal Transportation Agency Board of Directors on March 5, 2024 and construction has begun this month. Work this month included outlining the future roadway striping and parking meter relocations. You may notice temporary tow-away signs on blocks that have upcoming survey, marking, and paint work. This will generally proceed block-by block. The project extents are 17th Street for 13 blocks, from Potrero Avenue to Mississippi Street. The Potrero Hill community is home to a variety of eateries, parks, retail and commercial services, manufacturing, and nightlife. This project will improve an active bicycle network connection. The project also focuses on improvements to pedestrian safety on the corridor.

Frida Kahlo Way Quick Build Project

The Frida Kahlo Quick Build is on its way to the San Francisco Municipal Transportation Agency Board of Directors for considerations of project approvals on Tuesday, May 7, 2024. The project supports implementing goals and priorities identified in the recently completed District 7 Ocean Avenue Mobility Action Plan, previous planning efforts in the area, and SFMTA's Vision Zero Program. The proposed changes aim to improve safety for people walking and bicycling on Frida Kahlo Way and Judson Avenue west of Foerster Street while also improving transit reliability and access. Through an extended outreach period, staff have worked to include the many different stakeholders and consider the concerns of neighbors, CCSF faculty and staff, and CCSF students.

Larkin Street Quick-Build Project

The Larkin Street Quick-Build team kicked off project design and planning this month, with outreach planned for this summer. The project extents are Larkin Street from Market Street to Sutter Street. This project is part of a network of quick-build improvements in the Tenderloin and connects to the proposed Sutter Street Quick-Build Project. The project is working to improve pedestrian safety along the corridor. This north-south corridor is very active with many pedestrians and all types of uses including government agencies, civic amenities, housing, retail, restaurants, and services to name a few. In addition to high levels of foot and vehicle traffic, the 19 Polk bus route is on the corridor from Hayes Street to Geary Street. The project team will be coordinating with other city departments working on concurrent projects in the area.

Message: Dear Supervisors.

The ordinance put forth by Supervisor Chan amending the Administrative Code which would allow SFMTA to bypass important rules and best practices for entering into contracts is unconscionable.

The rules set forth in the Administrative Code governing contracts include competitive bidding, the Environmental Code, equal benefits, local business enterprise utilization and other important safeguards against corruption, fraud, and waste. The provisions in the Administrative Code should not be waivable or optional; they exist to protect the taxpayer, local business, local talent and presumably the environment.

Amending the Administrative Code is a drastic step towards granting an incompetent agency power they should not have. SFMTA simply is not an agency that can or should be trusted to enter into contracts without oversight or rules to guide the process and ensure best practice.

We are all currently feeling the consequences of unprecedented fiscal irresponsibility by our City government with a deficit that is threatening the operations of almost every department in the city.

Now is not the time to allow an agency with a known track record for shoddy data and over-budget projects to enter into contracts with no accountability and fewer protections to the process.

This ordinance's built in expiration date of 3 years provides little comfort to taxpayers as SFMTA has a habit of making things that are "temporary" permanent. It would be better not to go down this path of AMENDING a code then to try to re-establish it in the future. Once SFMTA can ignore all sensible elements to negotiating and entering into a contract it is safe to say it will remain that way indefinitely.

The failure of SFMTA to achieve its Vision Zero goals has less to do with streamlining a contract process and everything to do with their poor planning, lack of interest in community feedback, and little understanding of the city streets and how they are used. Vision Zero requires more than knee-jerk reactions and piecemeal projects, and until competence and data replaces ideology and fiction, no amount of streamlining any process will bring us closer to achieving safer streets or the goals of vision zero.

I urge you to abandon this ordinance and require SFMTA to continue to respect and adhere to the very necessary protections in our Administrative Code. Taxpayers, small businesses, and local workers can no longer bear the brunt of SFMTA's unproductive and community damaging projects.

The rules set forth in the Administrative Code governing contracts include competitive bidding, the Environmental Code, equal benefits, local business enterprise utilization and other important safeguards against corruption, fraud, and waste. The provisions in the Administrative Code should not be waivable or optional; they exist to protect the taxpayer, local business, local talent and presumably the environment.

Amending the Administrative Code is a drastic step towards granting an incompetent agency power they should not have. SFMTA simply is not an agency that can or should be trusted to enter into contracts without oversight or rules to guide the process and ensure best practice.

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Now is not the time to allow an agency with a known track record for shoddy data and over-budget projects to enter into contracts with no accountability and fewer protections to the process.

This ordinance's built in expiration date of 3 years provides little comfort to taxpayers as SFMTA has a habit of making things that are "temporary" permanent. It would be better not to go down this path of AMENDING a code then to try to re-establish it in the future. Once SFMTA can ignore all sensible elements to negotiating and entering into a contract it is safe to say it will remain that way indefinitely.

The failure of SFMTA to achieve its Vision Zero goals has less to do with streamlining a contract process and everything to do with their poor planning, lack of interest in community feedback, and little understanding of the city streets and how they are used. Vision Zero requires more than knee-jerk reactions and piecemeal projects, and until competence and data replaces ideology and fiction, no amount of streamlining any process will bring us closer to achieving safer streets or the goals of vision zero.

I urge you to abandon this ordinance and require SFMTA to continue to respect and adhere to the very necessary protections in our Administrative Code. Taxpayers, small businesses, and local workers can no longer bear the brunt of SFMTA's unproductive and community damaging projects.
