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3	Resolution adopting policy setting annual appropriations for General Fund
4	Departments at levels sufficient to compensate Hetch Hetchy Water & Power for all
5	electricity sales to such departments at a rate that at a minimum reflects the same cost
6	of service principles outlined in the City Charter (Sec. 8B.125. Rates).
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8	WHEREAS, The San Francisco Public Utilities Commission (SFPUC) operates the
9	Hetch Hetchy Power Enterprise (HHWP or Enterprise); and
10	WHEREAS, The SFPUC is responsible for developing and implementing public policy
11	related to generation and provision of electricity, including the promotion of conservation, and
12	renewable energy sources; and
13	WHEREAS, Implementing electricity public policy goals requires that the Enterprise
14	operate as a fiscally sound public utility; and
15	WHEREAS, Electricity prices reflecting cost of service encourage efficient use and
16	conservation of electricity; and
17	WHEREAS, Annual revenues must pay for operations & maintenance expenses; debt
18	service; replacement and reconstruction of existing assets and any new capital additions to
19	the Enterprise; and
20	WHEREAS, It is desirable that annual revenues be regular, predictable and sufficient to
21	pay all expenses of the Enterprise; and
22	WHEREAS, City departments are customers of HHWP and revenues from City
23	Departments represent a substantial portion of the Enterprise's annual revenues; and
24	WHEREAS, for the setting of retail water and sewer rates the Charter provides that the
25	SFPUC shall establish rates, fees and charges at levels sufficient to improve or maintain

1	financial condition and bond ratings at or above levels equivalent to highly rated utilities of
2	each enterprise under its jurisdiction, meet requirements and covenants under all bond
3	resolutions and indentures and provide sufficient resources for the continued financial health
4	(including appropriate reserves) operation, maintenance and repair of each enterprise
5	consistent with good utility practice; now, therefore be it,
6	RESOLVED, That it is the policy of the Board of Supervisors that it shall to make a
7	transition to annually appropriate funds for each General Fund Department in an amount that
8	is sufficient to compensate HHWP for all electricity sales to such departments at a rate that
9	reflects the same cost of service principles outlined in the City Charter (Sec. 8B.125. Rates).
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
