

1 [Accept and Expend Grant- Disproportionate Minority Contact Support Project - \$100,000]

3 **Resolution authorizing the Juvenile Probation Department (JPD) to retroactively accept**  
4 **and expend a grant in the amount of \$100,000 from the Federal Formula Grants**  
5 **Program for the Disproportionate Minority Contact (DMC) Support Project,**  
6 **administered by the Corrections Standards Authority (CSA), for calendar year 2011, to**  
7 **be used for implementation of a multifaceted approach to disparities reduction,**  
8 **including education, data and best practice review and community outreach.**

10 WHEREAS, JPD desires to participate in the DMC Support Grant Project; and

11 WHEREAS, The purpose of DMC Support Grant Project is to support local probation  
12 departments in reducing the racial/ethnic disparity and disproportionality in juvenile justice  
13 contact by strengthening and supporting those departments' DMC reduction activities; and

14 WHEREAS, JPD applied for these grant funds on December 10,2010; and was  
15 awarded \$100,000 by CSA December 20, 2010; and

16 WHEREAS, JPD intends to use the grant award implement a multifaceted approach to  
17 address disproportionate minority contact within San Francisco's juvenile justice system; and

18 WHEREAS, JPD proposes to maximize use of available grant funds on program  
19 expenditures by not including indirect costs in the grant budget; and

20 WHEREAS, The award period is from January 1, 2011 to December 31, 2011; and

21 WHEREAS, The grant does not require an ASO amendment; now, therefore, be it

22 **RESOLVED**, That the Chief Juvenile Probation Officer is retroactively authorized on  
23 behalf of the Board of Supervisors to submit the grant proposal for this funding; and be it

1 FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Chief Juvenile Probation Officer or his or her  
2 designee is authorized to accept and expend this grant award in the amount of \$100,000; and  
3 be it

4 FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Chief Juvenile Probation Officer is authorized to  
5 execute on behalf of the City and County of San Francisco the necessary grant agreement  
6 with CSA, including any amendments thereto; and, be it


7 FURTHER RESOLVED, That federal grant funds received hereunder shall not be used  
8 to supplant expenditures controlled by the Board of Supervisors; and, be it

9 FURTHER RESOLVED, That the City and County of San Francisco agrees to abide by  
10 the statutes and regulations governing the federal Formula Grants Program as well as the  
11 terms and conditions of the Grant Agreement as set forth by the CSA.
