

To the Clerk of the Board:

Our specialty grocery store Little Vine, opened on August 15th, 2011 at 1541 Grant Avenue. We have purchased a Type 20 (Off-Sale Beer & Wine ABC License No. 20-52223) from Boudin French Sourdough at 156 Jefferson Street, just 8 blocks away.

Our focus at Little Vine is primarily on farm fresh produce and meats, farmstead cheeses and other specialty food items. The projected wine sales, which under the North Beach NCD is limited to 15% of the store square footage, will be focused on family owned, small production Northern California wines, with an emphasis on great customer service. There is no other store in North Beach devoted to selling small production boutique wines. The reaction from the neighborhood has been nothing but positive, and we feel we are adding a much wanted business to a neglected yet historic block. We have met with the North Beach Neighbors, North Beach Merchants Association & the Telegraph Hill Dwellers and have the support of all three. There seems to be a consensus that Little Vine is a very positive addition to the neighborhood. Our hours of operation are 11:00 AM to 7:00 PM and we believe that our business would not be disruptive in any way to our neighbors, but rather enhance the enjoyment of the block.

In San Francisco there are only a handful of wine shops devoted to sourcing wines from small production family owned wineries. These wineries need the support from small shops like ours in order to keep afloat. Their production is not big enough to sell nationally or to the bigger chains. Little Vine, and small businesses like ours, serve not only a public convenience, but are necessary to preserve the San Francisco way of life, and by allowing us to sell wine keeps our business viable and will help keep our neighborhoods free of big box stores and national chains.

On a personal note, my wife and I have lived in San Francisco for 10 years, and have been homeowners in North Beach for 5 years. We have been disappointed with the lack of a wine shop in our area with an eclectic and affordable selection. I am a certified sommelier from the Court of Master Sommeliers and am excited to bring my expertise in sourcing these wines to my neighborhood. I know that the neighborhood is excited too!

Dear Ms. Garland:

This letter is in response to your request for a letter of determination regarding the establishment of a specialty retail grocery store at 1541 Grant Avenue, Lot 039 of Assessors Block 0103. The property is located within the North Beach Neighborhood Commercial District (NCD) and the 40-X Height and Bulk District. Planning Code Section 722.40 allows Other Retail Sales and Services as defined in Planning Code Section 790.102 as a principally permitted use on the first and second floors within the North Beach NCD. Section 790.102 includes specialty grocery, which is defined as an individual retail food establishment that:

- 1. Offers specialty food products, such as baked goods, pasta, cheese, confections, coffee, meat, seafood, produce, artisanal goods and other specialty food products, and may also offer additional food and non-food commodities related or complementary to the specialty food products;
- 2. May provide beer, wine, and/or liquor sales for consumption off the premises with a California Alcoholic Beverage Control Board License type 20 (off-sale beer and wine) or type 21 (off-sale general) within the accessory use limits as set forth in Section 703.2(b)(1)(C)(vi);
- 3. Prepares minor amounts or no food on-site for immediate consumption; and
- 4. Markets the majority of its merchandise at retail prices.

Planning Code Section 703.2(b)(1)(C)(vi) allows accessory sales of beer, wine, and/or liquor sales for the consumption off the premises with a State of California Alcoholic Beverage Control ("ABC") Board License type 20 (off-sale beer and wine) or type 21 (off-sale general) which occupy less than 15% of the gross square footage of the establishment (including all areas devoted to the display and sale of alcoholic beverages) in a general grocery store, specialty grocery store, or self-service specialty food use.

Planning Code Section 722.21 principally permits nonresidential uses in the North Beach NCD of up to 1,999 square feet in area, requires Conditional Use authorization for nonresidential uses of between 2,000 to 3,999 square feet in area, and prohibits nonresidential uses greater than 3,999 square feet in area.

Your proposed use, a specialty grocery store in a space less than 400 square feet in area with accessory sales of alcoholic beverages limited to 15% of the gross square footage of the establishment, is principally permitted on the first or second floors of the building at the subject property.

APPEAL: If you believe this determination represents an error in interpretation of the Planning Code or abuse in discretion by the Zoning Administrator, an appeal may be filed with the Board of Appeals within 15 days of the date of this letter.
