AUTHORIZING THE DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC HEALTH, POPULATION HEALTH AND PREVENTION DIVISION, TO ENTER INTO A SUBCONTRACT IN THE AMOUNT OF \$12,203 WITH THE NORTHERN CALIFORNIA CANCER CENTER, THE PRIMARY CONTRACTOR, TO PARTICIPATE IN A PROJECT TO IMPROVE PAP SMEAR FOLLOW-UP IN A HIGH-RISK UNDERSERVED POPULATION AND WHICH INCLUDES INDEMNIFICATION, BINDING ARBITRATION, AND RIGHTS IN DATA CLAUSES AND WHICH DOES NOT INCLUDE PATENT INFRINGEMENT INDEMNIFICATION AND FALSE CLAIMS CLAUSES; RETROACTIVE TO MARCH 1, 1998; WAIVING INDIRECT COSTS.

WHEREAS, The Northern California Cancer Center has received funds through the National Cancer Institute, Department of Health and Human Services, for a project entitled: Cancer Screening, Managed Care & the Underserved, including a strategy to improve pap smear follow-up in a high risk underserved population; and

WHEREAS, The Northern California Cancer Center, as the primary contractor, has requested the that the San Francisco City and County Department of Public Health, enter into a subcontract to participate in this project; and

WHEREAS, The subcontract specifies that Dr. Daramola Cabral-Evins, Population Health and Prevention Division, Community Health and Safety Services, Community Health Epidemiology, participates in this project by developing a strategy to improve pap smear follow-up in a high risk underserved population during the term of the subcontract; and;

WHEREAS, The Northern California Cancer Center has agreed to reimburse the San Francisco City and County Department of Public Health in the amount of \$12,203 under the terms of this subcontract; and

WHEREAS, As a condition of receiving the funds, the Northern California Cancer Center requires the City to enter into an agreement (the "Agreement"), a copy of which is on file with the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors in File No. 98-1247 ; and

WHEREAS, The Northern California Cancer Center has indicated that it will not agree to any modification to the form of the Agreement; and,

WHEREAS, The Agreement contains certain provisions described below, which require the approval of the Board of Supervisors; and,

WHEREAS, The Agreement does not contain certain provisions described below, which are required under the Administrative Code unless waived by the Board of Supervisors; and,

WHEREAS, The Northern California Cancer Center does not allow for indirect costs for this subcontract; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Supervisors desires to authorize the Department of Public Health, on behalf of the City, to enter into the agreement in order to receive and expend the funds for this and any future years; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, That the San Francisco City and County Department of Public Health is hereby authorized to enter into a subcontract in the amount of \$12,203 with The Northern California Cancer Center, the Primary Contractor, to improve pap smear follow-up in a high risk underserved population; retroactive to March 1, 1998; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors hereby approves the provision in the Agreement pursuant to which the City indemnifies The Northern California Cancer Center; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors hereby approves the provision in the Agreement pursuant to which the City agrees to submit all claims arising out of the Agreement to binding arbitration; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors hereby approves the provision in the Agreement pursuant to which the City agrees to grant a royalty-free and nonexclusive license for the use of data developed inder the contract; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors hereby waives the requirement contained in Sections 6.21 and 21.19 of the Administrative Code that the Agreement include an indemnification of the City by The Northern California Cancer Center for the infringement of patent rights; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors hereby waives the requirement contained in Section 6.57(c) of the Administrative Code that the Agreement include a paragraph reciting the false claim provisions contained in Section 6.57(a) of the Administrative Code; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors authorizes the Department of Public Health to enter into similar agreements with the Northern California Cancer Center if the contract is renewed.
