9 Section 1. The Board of Supervisors hereby submits to the qualified voters of the City  
10 and County, at an election to be held on November 8, 2016, a proposal to amend the Charter of  
11 the City and County by revising Section 8.100 and adding Section 13.111, to read as follows:

15 **Asterisks (\* \* \* \*)** indicate the omission of unchanged Charter

16 **SEC. 8.100. UNIFIED SCHOOL DISTRICT.**

17 The Unified School District shall be under the control and management of a Board of  
18 Education composed of seven members who shall be elected *pursuant to Section 13.111* by the  
19 *voters of the Unified School District.* A student representative shall serve on the Board in  
20 accordance with state law. No member of this Board shall be eligible to serve on the Governing  
21 Board of the Community College District. The compensation for each member shall be \$500 per  
22 month. *The terms of office in effect for Board members on the date this Charter is adopted shall*  
23 *continue.*

1 **SEC. 13.111. ELECTION OF BOARD OF EDUCATION.**

2 (a) Manner of Election.

3 (1) Beginning on January 1, 2017, and ending on the sunset date set forth in  
4 subsection (a)(2), elections for the Board of Education of the Unified School District shall be  
5 conducted in a manner that permits any San Francisco resident to vote who either:

6 (A) is a voter, as defined in Article XVII of this Charter, or

7 (B) is the parent, legal guardian, or caregiver (as defined in California  
8 Family Code Section 6550 or any successor legislation) of a child under age 19 residing in the  
9 San Francisco Unified School District, is the minimum age required under this Charter to vote in  
10 a municipal election, and is not disqualified from voting under Article II Section 4 of the  
11 California Constitution or any implementing State statute, regardless of whether the person is a  
12 United States citizen.

13 The Board of Supervisors may adopt ordinances implementing this subsection (a)(1).


14 (2) Subsection (a)(1)(B) authorizing non-citizens to vote in Board of Education  
15 elections shall expire by operation of law on December 31, 2022, or on December 31  
16 immediately following the third election for members of the Board of Education conducted in  
17 accordance with this Section 13.111, whichever is later. Thereafter, the Board of Supervisors  
18 may determine by ordinance whether non-citizens may vote in elections for members of the  
19 Board of Education.

20 (b) Limitations. This Section 13.111 shall apply only to elections for members of the  
21 Board of Education of the San Francisco Unified School District. Nothing in this Section 13.111  
22 shall affect the terms of office of members of the Board of Education, including incumbent

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members on the effective date of the Charter amendment enacting this Section. Nothing in this Section shall alter the definition of "elector" or "voter" set forth in Article XVII of this Charter.

[Charter Amendment - Non-Citizen Voting in School Board Elections]

**Describing and setting forth a proposal to the voters, at an election to be held on November 8, 2016, to amend the Charter of the City and County of San Francisco to authorize San Francisco residents who are not United States citizens but who are the parents, legal guardians, or caregivers of a child residing in San Francisco to vote in elections for the Board of Education.**

Existing Law

San Francisco residents who are 18 years of age or older, United States citizens, and not in prison or on parole for a felony conviction are eligible to register to vote in San Francisco elections, including elections for the Board of Education of the San Francisco Unified School District. Non-citizens are not eligible to register to vote.

Amendments to Current Law

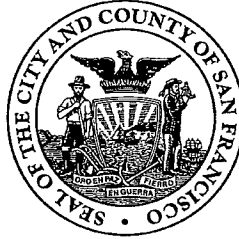
If approved by the voters, this Charter amendment would:

- Authorize San Francisco residents who are legal voting age and who are the parents, legal guardians, or caregivers for children in the San Francisco Unified School District to vote in elections for the Board of Education, regardless of whether the resident is a United States citizen.
- Authorize the Board of Supervisors to adopt ordinances implementing non-citizen voting in Board of Education elections.

Non-citizens would be permitted to vote only if they are legal voting age. Currently, voters must be at least 18 years old to vote, but a pending Charter amendment (Board File No. 150267) could lower the voting age to 16 for Board of Education elections and other municipal elections. Like citizens, non-citizens would be disqualified from voting if they are in prison or on parole for conviction of a felony, as required by Article II Section 4 of the California Constitution and implementing State statutes.

The provision authorizing non-citizen voting in Board of Education elections would “sunset” on December 31, 2022, or the December 31 immediately following the third School Board election conducted under the rules adopted in this Charter amendment, whichever is later. The Board of Supervisors, by ordinance, could authorize non-citizen voting in Board of Education elections to continue after that date.

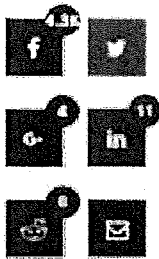

# Track Record

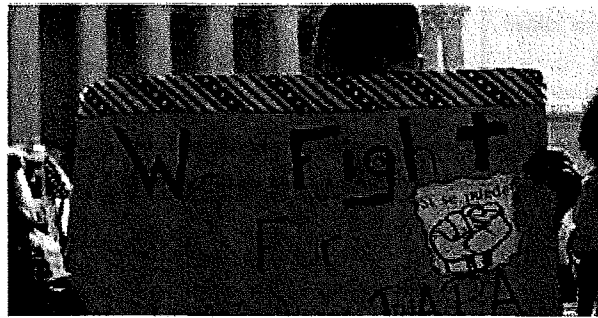




