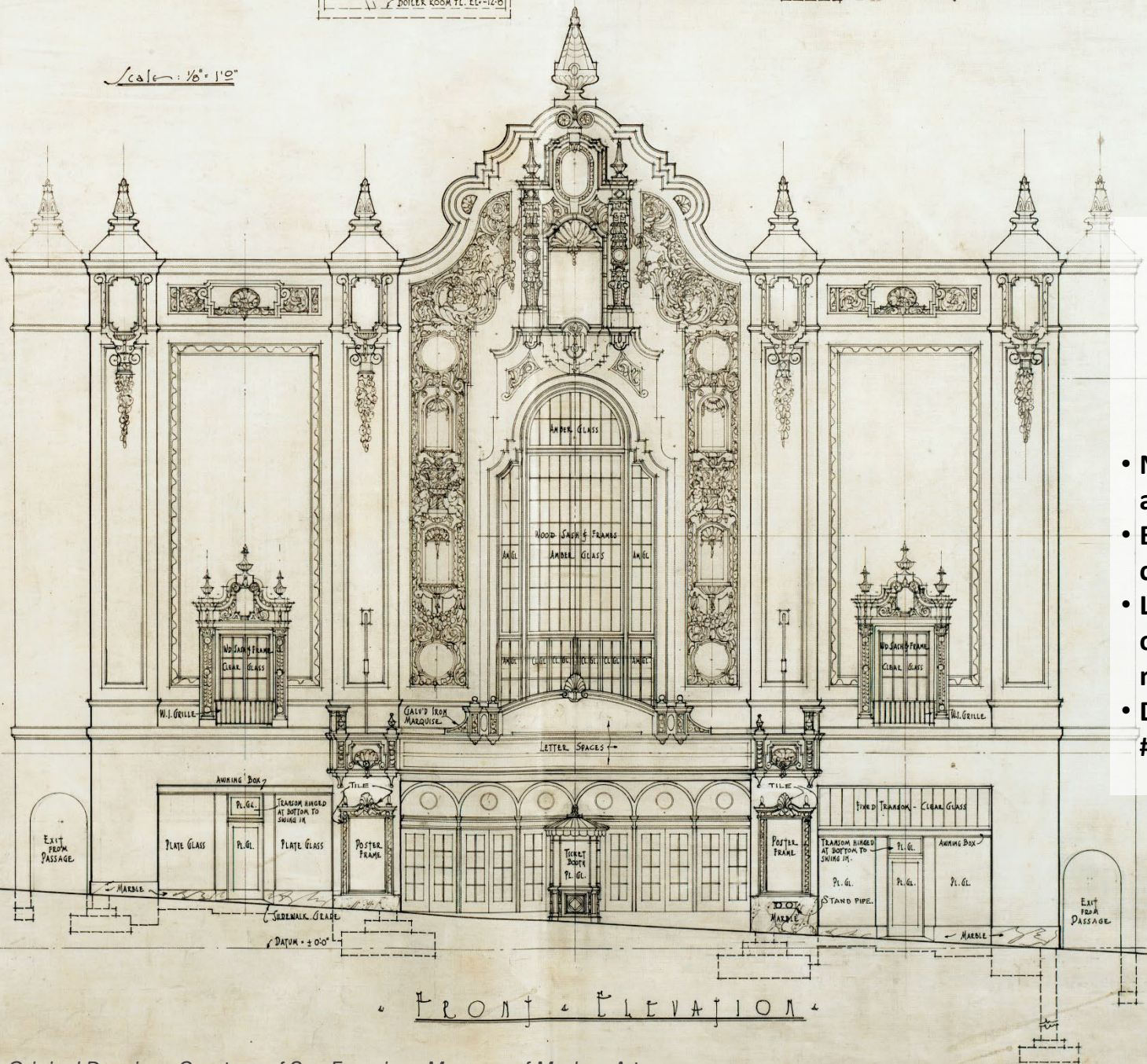

1922-1937

- Nasser Family enlisted architect Timothy Pflueger
- Early Eureka Valley commercial development
- Longest continually operating San Francisco movie palace
- Designated City Landmark #100 in 1977
