




DPH 16-17 Base Budget \$2.071B

Major Themes For FY16-18

- Opening New Zuckerberg San Francisco General Hospital
- Strengthening Behavioral Services
- Investing in Public Health Division
- Developing a Unified Electronic Health Record (EHR)

Opening New Zuckerberg San Francisco General Hospital

New facility scheduled to open in May 2016

Increased annual operating costs of \$32.4 M
with 119 additional FTE, included as part of FY
14-16 Budget

\$13.7 M Expansion of Behavioral Services

- Drug Medi-Cal Organized Delivery System Pilot Demonstration (\$6.9 M)
- Mental Health Services Act (MHSA) supporting many services including transgender services and Hummingbird Peer Respite (\$3.5 M)
- 2011 State Realignment Funds for programs including expanded Children's Mental Health Services (\$2.8 M)
- Integration of Jail Behavioral Health Services (\$500k)

Other Improvements in Behavioral Health

- 10 additional beds in the Mental Health Rehabilitation Center
- Inpatient Psychiatric Quality Improvement Project
- Facility improvements to Psych Emergency Services (PES) included in the Proposed 2016 Public Health and Safety Bond
- Continued Integration of Behavioral Health Services into Primary Care

Investing in Population Health

- Focus on quality improvement
- Supporting consumer protection under Environmental Health
 - Increased food inspectors to meet expected inventory
 - Increased protection of massage workers

Developing Unified Electronic Health Record

10 Year Cost for EHR	
Project Capital Costs	\$ (125,792,938)
Ongoing Operating Costs	\$ (214,745,904)
Total Annual Costs	\$ (341,918,891)
Less Expected DPH Savings	\$ 144,740,580
Net Cost	\$ (181,301,709)

- New system will improve patient care outcomes and mitigate financial risk
- Contract with UCSF currently being negotiated
