

1 [Continuum of Care Plan—Homeless Board Membership.]

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3 **Resolution amending the Continuum of Care Plan to reduce the size of the Local**  
4 **Homeless Coordinating Board to sixteen members: eight of whom are appointed by the**  
5 **Mayor, and eight of whom are appointed by the Board of Supervisors.**

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7 WHEREAS, The Board of Supervisors adopted the Continuum of Care Plan as San  
8 Francisco's homeless policy document governing the development of an integrated, effective  
9 and coordinated system of health care, housing, employment and support services to prevent  
10 and reduce homelessness, by Resolution No. 827-97; and

11 WHEREAS, A component of the Continuum of Care Plan was the creation of a Local  
12 Homeless Coordinating Board (Local Board) to advise City departments, commissions, and  
13 the Board of Supervisors on policy decisions and budget allocations consistent with the Plan;  
14 and

15 WHEREAS, In May 2002, the Controller published a report recommending that the  
16 Local Homeless Coordinating Board be reduced in size; now, therefore, be it

17 RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors amends the Continuum of Care Plan to  
18 reduce the size of the Local Homeless Coordinating Board to sixteen members; and, be it

19 FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors shall appoint eight members:  
20 the first five members shall be homeless, formerly homeless, advocates for, or service  
21 providers to (1) veterans, (2) families, (3) substance abusers, (4) disabled and/or mentally  
22 handicapped, and (5) victims of domestic violence; the sixth seat shall be for a representative  
23 of the business community; the seventh seat shall be for a representative of the hospitality  
24 industry; and, the eight seat shall be for a representative of a non-profit housing provider; and,  
25 be it

1           FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Mayor shall appoint eight members to the Local  
2 Homeless Coordinating Board: the first four shall be representatives of the Mayor's Office of  
3 Homelessness, the Department of Human Services, the Department of Public Health, and the  
4 Mayor's Office of Housing; and, the final four appointees shall either be representatives of the  
5 Mayor's Office of Community Development, the Department of Children, Youth, and Family,  
6 the Mayor's Criminal Justice Council, and the Department of Aging and Adult Services, or  
7 members of the public with demonstrated expertise in the areas over which each of these  
8 departments has jurisdiction.

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
