10 WHEREAS, Under the Stewart B. McKinney Homeless Assistance Act and Cranston
11 Gonzalez National Affordable Housing Act of 1990, the Secretary of the U.S. Department of
12 Housing and Urban Development (HUD) is authorized to make a grant to the City and County
13 of San Francisco under the Emergency Solutions Grants Program (ESG); and

14 WHEREAS, The Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security Act (CARES Act),
15 Public Law 116-136, was signed into law on March 27, 2020, to respond to the effects of the
16 public health crisis caused by the COVID-19 pandemic; and

17 WHEREAS, The CARES Act allocated \$4 billion in Emergency Solutions Grant
18 Coronavirus (ESG-CV) funds to be used to prevent, prepare for, and respond to COVID-19, of
19 which \$1 billion shall be allocated based on FY2020 ESG formula and \$3 billion shall be
20 allocated to states and units of local government based on a separate formula to be
21 developed by the Secretary of HUD; and

22 WHEREAS, San Francisco's received an award letter for a ESG-CV allocation based
23 on the FY2020 ESG formula for \$5,501,459 (Round 1 Entitlement) and an additional
24 allocation based on a new needs-based formula for \$43,605,003 (Round 2 Entitlement); and

25

1 WHEREAS, San Francisco enacted Ordinance No. 301-20 (File 200617) on July 20,
2 2020, authorizing the Mayor to apply for, accept, and expend ESG-CV Round 1 Entitlement
3 according to the ESG-CV Round 1 Expenditure Plan; and

4 WHEREAS, San Francisco enacted Ordinance No. 374-20 (File 200851) on August 21,
5 2020, authorizing the Mayor to apply for, accept, and expend ESG-CV Round 2 Entitlement
6 according to the ESG-CV Round 2 Expenditure Plan and amend the ESG Program Round 1
7 Entitlement Plan in the amount of \$3,250,000; and

8 WHEREAS, ESG-CV eligible uses include the rehabilitation or conversion of buildings
9 for use as emergency shelters for the homeless, payment of certain operating and social
10 service expenses in connection with emergency shelters and for homeless prevention
11 activities, and other flexible uses for low and moderate-income individuals, including
12 reimbursement for the costs of eligible activities incurred during the pandemic regardless of
13 date; and

14 WHEREAS, The CARES Act authorizes the Secretary to grant waivers and alternative
15 requirements of statutes and regulations to expedite and facilitate the use of funds to prepare
16 for and respond to COVID-19, including the following flexibilities: may deviate from applicable
17 procurement standards when using these funds to procure goods and services; the availability
18 of a 5-day public comment period for amendments to the Consolidated Plan/Action Plan, and
19 uncaps the percentage of CDBG funding for public services to prevent, prepare for, and
20 respond to coronavirus; and

21 WHEREAS, The ESG-CV Round 1 Entitlement Expenditure Plan was posted on
22 Mayor's Office of Housing and Community Development's (MOHCD) website on June 8,
23 2020, and was open for public comment for five days, and a proposed amendment to the
24 Round 1 Entitlement Expenditure Plan (Amended Round 1 Expenditure Plan) was posted on
25

1 MOHCD's website on August 3, 2020, and was open for public comment for five days, a copy
2 of which is incorporated in File No. 200851; and

3 WHEREAS, The ESG-CV Round 2 Entitlement Expenditure Plan was posted on
4 MOHCD's website on August 3, 2020, and was open for public comment for five days, a copy
5 of which is incorporated in File No. 200851; and

6 WHEREAS, A proposed amendment to the Round 2 Entitlement Expenditure Plan
7 (Amended Round 2 Expenditure Plan) was posted on MOHCD's website on March 16,
8 2021, and was open for public comment for five days, a copy of which is incorporated in File
9 No. 210308 and incorporated herein by reference; and

10 WHEREAS, The proposed grant does not require an Annual Salary Ordinance
11 amendment; and

12 WHEREAS, HUD does not allow use of the grant on indirect costs; now, therefore, be it

13 RESOLVED, That Mayor of the City and County of San Francisco is hereby authorized
14 to amend the ESG-CV Round 2 Expenditure Plan in the amount of \$10,000,000 for the period
15 beginning July 1, 2020, through June 30, 2023; and

16 FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors does hereby approve the
17 purposes and goals for ESG-CV Program funding as set forth in the Expenditure Schedule for
18 recipient agencies and departments; and, be it

19 FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors hereby waives inclusion of
20 indirect costs in the grant budget; and, be it

21 FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Mayor is hereby authorized to enter into and execute
22 agreements between the City and County of San Francisco and various agencies consistent
23 with the ESG Program and the Expenditure Schedule; and, be it

24 FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Mayor is hereby authorized to submit documentation
25 and certifications as may be requested or required by HUD, and to take such additional

1 actions as may be required to apply for, accept and expend the ESG funds consistent with
2 this Resolution and the goals of the ESG-CV Program and all applicable legal requirements,
3 and any such actions are solely intended to further the purposes of this Resolution, and are
4 subject in all respect to the terms of this Resolution, and any such action cannot increase the
5 risk to the City, or require the City to expend any resources, and that the Mayor shall consult
6 with the City Attorney prior to execution and provided that within 30 days of the agreements
7 approved by this Resolution being executed by all parties, such final documents (showing
8 marked changes, if any) shall be provided to the Clerk of the Board, for inclusion in the official
9 file, together with a brief explanation of any actions from the date of the adoption of this
10 Resolution; and, be it

11 FURTHER RESOLVED, That all actions heretofore taken by the officers of the City
12 with respect to the application for, or the acceptance or expenditure of, ESG-CV funds, as
13 consistent with the documents herein and this Resolution, are hereby approved, confirmed
14 and ratified.



Subject to the CARES Act and any waivers or alternative requirements HUD shall make as provided by that Act, the Recipient's Consolidated Plan submissions (including the Recipient's approved annual Action Plan and any amendments), the Emergency Solutions Grants Program regulations at 24 CFR Part 576 (as now in effect and as may be amended from time to time), and this Agreement, including any special conditions and requirements attached to this Agreement, constitute part of this Agreement. Subject to the terms and conditions of this Agreement, HUD will make the funds available to the Recipient upon execution of this Agreement by the Recipient and HUD. The funds may be used for costs incurred by a State or locality before the Period of Performance, provided the costs are otherwise allowable and were incurred to prevent, prepare for, and respond to coronavirus. The Recipient agrees to assume all of the responsibilities with respect to environmental review, decision making, and action required under the HUD regulations at 24 CFR Part 58, subject to the exception the CARES Act provides for temporary emergency shelters. Nothing in this Agreement shall be construed as creating or justifying any claim against the federal government or the Recipient by any third party. Serving Youth Who Lack 3rd Party Documentation or Live in Unsafe Situations

Notwithstanding any contrary requirements under the McKinney-Vento Homeless Assistance Act or 24 CFR part 576, youth aged 24 and under who seek assistance (including shelter, services or rental assistance) shall not be required to provide third-party documentation that they meet the homeless definition in 24 CFR 578.3 as a condition for receiving assistance; and unaccompanied youth aged 24 and under (or families headed by youth aged 24 and under) who have an unsafe primary nighttime residence and no safe alternative to that residence shall be considered homeless for purposes of assistance provided by any private nonprofit organization whose primary mission is to provide services to youth aged 24 and under and families headed by youth aged 24 and under.

Recipient Integrity and Performance Matters

(applicable if the amount in Box 8 of the Agreement is greater than \$500,000)

The Recipient shall comply with the requirements in Appendix XII to 2 CFR part 200—Award Term and Condition for Recipient Integrity and Performance Matters.

Restriction on CARES Act Funds

The funds under this Agreement may only be used to prevent, prepare for, and respond to coronavirus, among individuals and families who are homeless or receiving homeless assistance, and to support additional homeless assistance and homelessness prevention activities to mitigate the impacts created by coronavirus.

We respectfully request retroactive approval to modify the expenditure plan for the CARES Act Emergency Solutions Grant (ESG-CV) Round 2 grant for period beginning July 1, 2020 through June 30, 2023 (File 210308).

When the Board of Supervisors initially approved the ESG-CV Round 2 grant in August 2020, 100% of the grant was required to cover the City's anticipated expenditures for the COVID Shelter-in-Place (SIP) Hotel program serving homeless San Franciscans. In early 2021, the new Federal administration announced that FEMA would be covering additional costs related to the SIP Hotel program. This announcement allows \$10M of ESG-CV Round 2 grant funds to be redeployed to the COVID homeless shelter program at Moscone, reducing potential burden on the General Fund.
