URGING THE SECRETARY OF COMMERCE TO ALTER THE CURRENT BOUNDARY OF THE GULF OF FARALLONES NATIONAL MARINE SANCTUARY TO ENCOMPASS THE ENTIRE GULF OF FARALLONES, WHICH IS CURRENTLY WITHIN THE MONTEREY BAY NATIONAL MARINE SANCTUARY.

WHEREAS, San Francisco County has two national marine sanctuaries off its coast (Gulf of Farallones National Marine Sanctuary and Monterey Bay National Marine Sanctuary); and

WHEREAS, 95% of the ocean in these two sanctuaries lies within the Gulf of the Farallones Marine Sanctuary; and

WHEREAS, the ocean area and marine flora and fauna are a part of the Gulf of Farallones and not part of the Monterey Bay ecosystem; and

WHEREAS, San Francisco is linked economically and culturally to the San Francisco Bay which is directly tied to the Gulf of the Farallones National Marine Sanctuary and not the Monterey Bay National Marine Sanctuary; and

WHEREAS, based on studies of the physical and biological attributes of the area, leading scientists in the field believe the Gulf region to be an ecological unit, encompassing the ocean and coastal area from Point Reyes to Point Ano Nuevo; and

WHEREAS, the people of San Francisco associate the "Farallones" and surrounding ecosystem as part of the Gulf of the Farallones National Marine Sanctuary and not the Monterey Bay National Marine Sanctuary; and

WHEREAS, Bay Area Congressional Representatives endorse this position and are willing to assist the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration to accomplish a realignment of the Gulf of the Farallones National Marine Sanctuary and Monterey Bay National Marine Sanctuary boundaries to reflect the needs of the citizens of San Francisco,

the biological and oceanographic conditions and the efficiency management for the sanctuaries; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, the Board of Supervisors of the City and County of San Francisco urge the Secretary of Commerce alter the current boundary of the Gulf of the Farallones National Marine Sanctuary to encompass the entire Gulf of Farallones, which is currently within the Monterey Bay National Marine Sanctuary. This is the area from Ano Nuevo north (the Santa Cruz/San Mateo County line) to the current southern boundary of the Gulf of the Farallones; and

RESOLVED, the Board of Supervisors requests the Secretary of Commerce transfer all management authority and responsibility to the Gulf of the Farallones while this boundary change is underway; and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Mayor is requested to transmit a copy of this Resolution to Dan Basta, Acting Chief of the National Marine Sanctuaries Division, National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration with a request they take all actions necessary to carry out the intent of this resolution.
