 12 Section 1. The San Francisco Police Code is hereby amended by amending Sections
 13 2.26 and 2.27, to read as follows:

15 Section 2. The San Francisco Police Code is hereby amended by adding Section 2.31,
16 to read as follows:

17 **SEC. 2.31. ANNUAL ADJUSTMENT OF FEES.**

18 Beginning with fiscal year 2003-2004, fees set in Sections 2.26 and 2.27 may be adjusted each
19 year, without further action by the Board of Supervisors, to reflect changes in the relevant Consumer
20 Price Index, as determined by the Controller .

21 No later than April 15th of each year, the Police Department shall submit its current fee
22 schedule to the Controller, who shall apply the price index adjustment to produce a new fee schedule
23 for the following year.

24 No later than May 15th of each year, the Controller shall file a report with the Board of
25 Supervisors reporting the fee new schedule and certifying that: (a) the fees produce sufficient revenue

1 to support the costs of providing the services for which each fee is assessed, and (b) the fees do not
2 produce revenue which is significantly more than the costs of providing the services for which each fee
3 is assessed.
