16	WHEREAS, Bettie Mae Fikes is a musician who gives talks about the Civil Rights
17	Movement throughout the country and leads children's workshops; and,
18	WHEREAS, Jon Fromer, winner of 12 Northern California Emmys and one National
19	Emmy and a producer for KQED Television has been producing quality television
20	programming in the Bay Area for 30 years; and,

8	free, just and equal societies through song and music, and today works as a health advocate
