Whereas, Increasingly transportation has become a priority issue for seniors in San Francisco and outstanding services such as Senior Escort cannot meet the full demand and needs of seniors; and,

Whereas, Throughout the nation and in San Francisco, there will be a sharp increase in the elderly population and there is a critical need to address the needs of our senior population in much the same way the City has addressed the needs of youth, women and the issue of economic development within the framework of a citywide summit; now, therefore, be it

Resolved, That the San Francisco Board of Supervisors hereby urges the Mayor of San Francisco to hold a Senior Summit in January, 1999.
