[HIV/AIDS DRUGS]

URGING THE CALIFORNIA STATE LEGISLATURE AND GOVERNOR DAVIS TO APPROVE ASSEMBLY BILL 217 MAKING FDA-APPROVED HIV/AIDS DRUGS AVAILABLE TO PARTICIPANTS IN MEDI-CAL MANAGED CARE PROGRAMS.

WHEREAS, Over the past 18 years of the AIDS epidemic, more than 25,000 residents of San Francisco have been diagnosed with AIDS; and,

WHEREAS, The number of deaths among persons with AIDS in San Francisco has been decreasing since 1994 which appears to be due in part to the availability of new drug therapies; and,

WHEREAS, Broader access to combination drug therapies throughout the HIV-infected population may help reduce the overall rate of HIV transmissions; and

WHEREAS, Combination therapies for the treatment of HIV are extremely expensive, costing between \$10,000 and \$15,000 per person per year; and,

WHEREAS, Many people living with HIV/AIDS are either low-income at the onset of their illness or become impoverished because of the decreased capacity to work and/or the expense associated with therapies for the treatment of HIV disease; and

WHEREAS, Approximately half of all Californians living with AIDS rely on Medi-Cal for their health care; and,

WHEREAS, Approximately 40% of all Medi-Cal beneficiaries are now served by managed care programs; and,

WHEREAS, Under existing state law, Medi-Cal managed care program participants do not have access to all the FDA approved HIV/AIDS drugs available to Medi-Cal fee-for-service beneficiaries;

WHEREAS, Assembly Bill 217, introduced by Assembly Member Wildman, would require the State Department of Health Services to reimburse managed care plans for the cost of HIV/AIDS drugs or to renegotiate contracts with managed care providers so that FDA approved HIV/AIDS drugs can be made available to participants in the Medi-Cal managed care programs; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, That the San Francisco Board of Supervisors endorses Assembly bill 217 and urges the Legislature and Governor to approve the legislation; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That a copy of this resolution be forwarded to his Honor, the Mayor, with a request that he transmit copies to the delegation from San Francisco in the State Legislature, as well as Governor Davis, with a request they take all action necessary to pass Assembly Bill 217 and to further the objectives of this resolution.
