PROCLAIMING JUNE AS LESBIAN GAY BISEXUAL TRANSGENDER MENTAL HEALTH
AWARENESS MONTH AND COMMENDING GAYLESTA FOR ADDRESSING AND
MEETING THE SPECIAL MENTAL HEALTH NEEDS OF THE GAY, LESBIAN, BISEXUAL,
AND TRANSGENDER COMMUNITIES.

WHEREAS, Gaylesta, a Bay Area organization comprised of over 200 practicing transgender, bisexual, lesbian, and gay psychotherapists, maintain that there's a genuine lack of awareness of mental health issues within the queer community and the seriousness of these problems which confront members of transgender, bisexual, lesbian, and gay community throughout all stages of their lives; and

WHEREAS, Due to the ever changing social, cultural and political climate, the mental health needs of the queer community have also changed over the last decade; and

WHEREAS, Young people are coming out an earlier age and are face with concomitant challenges such dealing with parental homophobia, violence in the schools, teen suicide, isolation, developing self esteem in a homophobic environment and school curriculum which doesn't reflect the history and socio-political culture of the queer community; and

WHEREAS, In the past, those diagnosed with HIV simply prepared for their deaths; however, with advances in HIV/AIDS therapy which has enabled many people living with HIV to live longer and to live more normal lives; people living with HIV are now having to deal with returning to the work force, rebuilding relationships, and preparing for the future; and

WHEREAS, Of the 8 million lesbian and gay families and the over 16 million children that are being raised by queer heads of households, over 100.000 reside in the Bay Area; and

WHEREAS, Some of the challenges faced by queer parents are raising children with varying sexual orientations, coming out to children when they come of age, lack of nurseries

and child care centers that are gay sensitive and gay friendly, and school curriculum which rarely reflects the social, political, and cultural realities of gay people and; and

WHEREAS, The lack of safe, public social spaces within the larger community where LGBT community can congregate force many to only socialize within bars and nightclubs which predispose many to alcoholism and substance abuse; and;

WHEREAS, High numbers of women developing breast cancer and the associated challenges of living with cancer is a major problem within the women's community; and;

WHEREAS, In addition, other common issues within the LGBT community are dealing with domestic violence, maintaining healthy, long term relationships, maintain self esteem in a larger homophobic society, confronting racism and sexism within the gay community, dealing with hate crimes and hate violence and employment discrimination; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors of the City and County of San Francisco declares June as Lesbian Gay Bisexual Transgender Awareness Month; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Board of Supervisors recognizes the special mental health needs of the gay community and commends Gaylesta for addressing those challenges and providing the needed support to the Bay Area's gay community and their families.
